



Bids will be received until 2 p. m. May 28, 1971, in the Soil Conservation Service office at Temple, Texas for the construction of a flood control dam at Site 32 of the Upper Pecan Bayou Watershed. Site 32 is approximately two miles south of May in Brown Jean Robertson, Sweetwa-County.

The Upper Pecan Bayou Watershed takes in all the area above Lake Brownwood that drains into Pecan Bayou. Site 32 is located on the C. R. Ranches.

Major bid items of work are: 146,758 cubic yards of earthfill; 22.4 cubic yards of reinforced concrete; and 5,110 linear feet of fencing.






