

## Griffin May Vote **Against Nominee** For High Court

WASHINGTON (UPI) -Sen. Robert P. Griffin, R-Mich., tapped for the Senate Judiciary Committee partly to provide a sure vote for Supreme Court nominee Clement F. Haynsworth, backed off today and indicated he might vote against confirmation.

"I'm re-evaluating the situation," Griffin told newsmen after questioning Haynsworth. "I'm going to reserve final judgment."

Most observers, however, expected Haynsworth to win approval handily, barring any unexpected disclosures. There are still 20 witnesses to be

## 1970s Look Good For Republicans

Washington Correspondent WASHINGTON (NEA)- With the dawning of the "politics of the '70s" just a few short. months away, the prospect today is that President Nixon, old-style politician, will dominate the scene for at least two-thirds of the decade ahead.

Even though he has not yet ended the Vietnam war, licked inflation or bit deep into urban problems, the President is riding high. He could falter if he does not make substantial progress on these issues. But it .might take a considerable disaster to beat him in 1972.




