PRAGUE-(AP)- A line of weeping mourners nearly two miles long filed through Czernin Palace today to place flowers on the bier of Foreign Minister Jan Masaryk..

Masaryk's body lay in state from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m., but the throng was so vast the doors of the palace opened an hour early to permit school children to pass through.

As the mourners filed through huge square in front of the palace where Masaryk fell to his death Wednesday, others queued up below for the walk up Hradcany Mountain.

Senators Decide on Tax Cut Bil

WASHINGTON-(AP)-Senate Republican leaders lined up today behind a \$4,700,000,000 income tax cut bill-and hoped for strong Democratic support. The Senate Finance Committee voted 10 to 1 last night for

a tax slash of that size. In doing so, it whittled \$1,800,000,000 from the \$6,500,000,000 tax bill passed overwhelmingly by the House Feb. 2.

The purpose of the Senate strategy is to try to win enough Democratic votes to pass a bill over the presidential veto the Republicans expect. That would take a two-thirds majority in both the Senate and House.

Except for one major change which trimmed the amount of the cut, the Senate measure is practically the same as the House

The Senate bill provides for percentage tax cuts ranging from 12.6 percent for those with net incomes of up to \$2,000; 7.4 percent on the second of the secon cent on incomes of from \$2,000 to \$136,719; and 5 percent on ncomes over \$136,719.
The range of House bill reductions is 30 percent on incomes

WASHINGTON-(AP)-President Truman today pitted this country's full political power and prestige against the spread of communism anywhere—including China.

At the same time a five-point administration plan began to emerge; a plan for coming to grips with what Secretary of State Marshall corsiders a "great crisis" in the world.

Within a few hours of each other, both the President and his secretary of state spoke out with extraordinary frankness on the state of affairs resulting from the bitter conflict between Russia and the western powers.







Is Changing LONDON-(P)-Britons are gol

Crimes by wemen have doubleds risen by 50 percent.

These changes in Britain's tional life, are shown in the first abstract of statistics for the Unit Kingdom.

The abstract, issued by the Can tral Statistical Office, shows the drift of population from the rural districts in England and Wales contined. More marked was the movement of people from the north to the south of England. There was a large decrease in the civil population of the London South eastern region.

Illegitimacy showed signs of declining in 1946 after having reached a war-time peak. The number of illegitimate births, which averaged about 32,000 (4.5 percent) the outbreak of war, rose to 71,000 (8.9 percent) in 1945 and fell in 1946 to 62,000 (6.5 percent).

Statistics since 1870 show that every year more men than women die. In 1870 by far the largest number of male deaths — 80,000 infants under one year. In 1946 such deaths were only 7.9 percent. and deaths of men over 75 prised 27.6 percent of the total. Figures for women show a sim-

ilar trend. In 1945 there were 312,700 bachelors in the United Kingdom, compared with 275,900 in 1948; and the number of spinsters was 320,000 against 387,000.
