

## **Orbiter Snaps** Lunar Landing Photographs

PASADEA, Calif. (UPI) -America's second lunar Orbiter spacecraft photographed the first 13 potential lunar landing sites for Apollo estronauts today, but telemetry data indicated an "irregularity" during the picture taking some 29 miles above the moon.

The irregularity "could not be explained at this time." Orbiter control announced about 30 minutes later:

The data showed the camera's shutter mechanism apparently opened and closed twice as often as it should have. However, results of the photographic pass would not be known until after the exposed film was processed in Orbiter's on-board developing system then transmitted to a tracking station at Madrid, Spain.

Would Boost Care

ADA officers estimated that, fully carried out, the program would raise the amount of dental care in the country by onefourth. Its target would be the estimated 74 million persons in the United States who are under 19, and it would attempt to give dental treatment and care to the children of the needy and underprivileged.

Government money would be used only for dental service offered to the indigent and "dentally indigent."

"It is a landmark," Dr. Maynard K. Hine of Indianapolis. president of the ADA, said. He called children's dental care an enormous problem.


