## Artillery, Jets Used In Heaviest Fighting

By ELIAV SIMON

JERUSALEM (UPI) - Israeli and Jordanian artillery fought along the Jordan River truce line today in what military observers called the heaviest border fighting since the 1967 Middle East war. Israel said the battle ended when her jets silenced giant Russian-built guns.

In Amman, Jordan accused the Israeli jets of bombing village, killing 25 persons and wounding 50 more.

But a military spokesman here said the jets, striking a second time in 24 hours against artillery positions in Jordan, struck Soviet-provided 122mm guns manned by Iraqi troops. The spokesman said the heavy guns had been torturing Israli settlements along the 20 mile frontier, where the artillery duel thundered before dawn. The Jerusalem spokesman




