Reconnaissance Orbiter passed the biggest Reconnaissance Corbiter passed the biggest
test of iss life by safely entering orbit around the Red Planet，joining a constellation of ircling spacecraft． But other challenges lie ahead

## RRC posts monthly oil, gas statistics

AUSTIN - The Commission issued a total of 1,413
original drilling permits in December 2005 compared to 1,308 in December 2004. The December total included 1,217 permits to drill new oil and gas wells, 42 to re-enter existing well bores, and 154 for re-completions. Pas, 728 oil and gas, 41 injection, zero service and 15 other permits.
Texas preliminary November 2005 crude oil production averaged 903,044 barrels daily, down from the 910,641 barrels daily average of November 2004.
The preliminary Texas crude oil production figure for November 2005 is $27,108,942$ barrels, a decrease from
$27,319,228$ barrels reported during November 2004 27,319,228 barrels reported during November 2004 45 injection and 2 other completions compared to 280 oil, 875 gas, 12 injection and 3 other completions during December 2004
Total well completions for 2005 year to date are 11,007 , up from 10,966 recorded during the same period in 2004 . holes in December 2005 compared to 430 holes plugged and 25 dry holes in December 2004.
Texas oil and gas wells produced $418,968,841$ Mcf (thousand cubic feet) of gas based upon preliminary production figures for November 2005, down from the November 2004 preliminary gas production total of
$432,954,281$ Mcf. November 2005 came from 135,497 oil and 66,966 gas
