The Dallas Morning News on corruption and the border: It should surprise no one that people
smugglers along the U.S.-Mexico bor der are adopting the same routes and tactics employed by major drug traffickers. Illegal immigrants are willing to pay hundreds or thousands of dollars to ride in the hollowed-out spaces and border.
For smuggling groups, human cargo is highly profitable and far less risky than moving drugs. For immigrants,
this is the quickest and surest way to
get into the United States. Studies in
recent years indicate that as border
enforcement tightens, demand jumps enforcement tightens, demand jumps for these smugglers. So do profits. According to one U.S. specialist, Mexican border smugglers are sitting
atop a $\$ 5$ billion industry. atop a $\$ \$$ billion industry. That's why corruption is growing rapidy among the U.S. border patrol
officers charged with stopping it. Like drug traffickers, people smugglers are targeting American law enforcement personnel whose low pay makes them susceptible to the lure of bribery. When enforcers look the other way and wave
smuggling vehicles throwigh, America's illegal immigrant population grows. According to a recent New York Times report, the Department of Homeland Security now has more than

200 open cases against border-area
U.S. law enforcement personnel. Texas U.S. law enforcement personnel. Texas is, by far, the leader, with 157 cases
being prosecuted against border guards in the past five years. The state's corruption caseload has nearly quadrupled ince 2003.
Officers on the take from people mugglers quickly become susceptible rms traffickers and money launderers. Increasing the pay of border patrol officers can go only so far in solving the problem.
A better way to halt this scourge is hrough comprehensive reform of America's immigration laws, giving migrant workers greater access to See BORDER, Page 5

## Lowering stress helps build immunity

AMARILLO - Relax. It may be an important part of

said a Texas AgriLife Extension Service specialist. "The top recommendation for keeping a strong immune system is reducing stress,"
said Andrew Crocker, said Andrew Crocker,
AgriLife Extension gerontolAgritire Extension gerontol-
ogy specialist in Amarillo. "Stress and what happens in your body during stress may negatively impact your ability to remain healthy,"
Crocker said. "The good news Crocker said. "The good news
is that lowering your stress can help your body maintain both your physical and your emotional health."
The immune system is the body's defense against infecinvaders, he said. When problems occur with the network of cells, tissues and organs that work together to protect the body, the result can be illness and infection.

a general protection everyone
is borm with and includes the external barriers of the body,
like the skin and mucous like the skin and mucous
membranes, which are the first line of defense in preventing diseases.
which involves immunity, which involves the lympho-

with exposure to diseases or through vaccination.

- Passive immunity, which is "borrowed" from another source and lasts for a short time, such as antibodies in a mother's breast milk provide
temporary immunity to diseases to which the mother has been exposed.
The cells that are part of this defense system are white Crocker explained They come in two basic types which combine to seek out and destroy the organisms or substances that cause disease Leukocytes are produced and stored in locations throughout
the body, including the thythe body, including the thy-
mus gland, spleen and bone marrow.
The leukocytes circulate through the body between the organs and nodes by means of the lymphatic vessels and
blood vessels, he said. In this way, the immune system works to monitor the body for germs or substances that might rause problems. The two basic types o leukocytes are: phagocytes,
which eat invading organisms; and lymphocytes, which allow the body to remember
