As we write this news aritcle, Gray County range operators are
attempting to sign-up considerable acreage for a cost-share grasshopper spray program
It looks like
It looks like that three different areas are getting blocked up to
spray in the cost-share program spray in the cost-share program. These areas are: along the
Gray-Wheeler County line northof the river: around Bowers City and southeast towards Lefors; and then an area southeast of McLean over into northwest Collingsworth County.
Gray County also has a lot of areas with grasshoppers that will not
be in any spray program. Producers and homeowners with be in any spray program. Producers and homeowners with
grassshoppers will need to take care of your own grasshopper problem areas now. The sooner you spray heavily infested areas, the
better control will be. better control will be.
Look for signs of in
Look for signs of infestations along roadsides and weed patches
and efcee rows bordering cultivated fields. Many of the grasshoppers that damage new crops and gardens hatch in these idle areass. Early
treatment of these areas before the young hoppers move from treatment of these areas before the young hoppers move from their
hatching will greatly reduce the amount of acreage that $m$ ght otherwise require treatment later.
In some situations, crops and gardens will need to be treated to prevent extensive damage. Baits applied to field margins have long
been a means of grasshopper control. The following insecticides are approved for most crops. gardens and rangeland: Sevin, Diazinon and Malathion. In addition. Toxaphene is approved for most crops
and Penncap and Dibrom are approved for rasshopper contro in and Penncap and Dibrom are approved for grasshopper control in

## No magic in teaching math

| No magic exists for teaching children arithmetic, despite new and innovative methods being used in education. <br> Schools and educators usually have to work together to provide the best education possible in all areas of study <br> The Pampa School District took important steps in improving its math program in 1977, when some of its members formulated a competency test for sixth graders. <br> Although the test provides no magic formula for teaching, it does weigh students' achievements and deficiencies in basic arithmetic, said Marjorie Gaut. the Assistant to the Superintendent in Educational Services <br> Betty Graham. a high school math teacher and the coordinator of the competency test. said she had seen improvement in the understanding of fractions and the computation of whoie numbers since the first test was given. <br> In overall grading, a chart for tests taken at the end of school years between 1977 and 1979 shows favorable results. <br> The same basic test has been given every year, said Graham, although some questions have been reworded for more clarity <br> In 1977. 271 students took the test and 16.2 percent of them scored in the 90 percentile. The same category showed a 7.7 percent increase in 1979 when 268 youngsters took it. <br> However. the percentage in the upper percentile had dropped to 12.9 in 1978. <br> The 1977 school system had nine students in the 30 and 40 percentiles while no students scored below 50 in 1979 with the exception of one youngster who reportedly did not try. 1978 <br> Four students were included in the two lower scoring ranges in <br> The tests were taken from results of a Region XVI Service Centef meeting, at which Graham. Kay Hood and Floyd Sackett discussed basic math objectives for elementary students with opther area representatives. |

these strands, according to the standards set by the test They are: non - metric geometry, operations and their properties, number and numeration development. mathematieal sentencees, measurement, charrs and graphs, and statistics and probability .Most the test tried to cover essentials needed to get along in lifpe. Sixth grade teachers in the system submitted questions in these
categories to Graham. who selected those to be used on the test categories to Graham. who selected those to be used on the test.
The exam measures whether a student understands what he should after his first six years of school. said Gaut. who also explained why A student has a minimum of four years in math courses after the sixth grade. said Gaut.
Gaut said problems in math learning can be pinpointed to enable Gaut said problems in math learning can be pinpointed to enable
educators to better plan the upcoming curriculum. Administrators also are better able to evaluate programs on how
they related to student learning goals through the tests, she said. Remedial programs for those who are not meeting the essential goals have been used. she said.
To give the test more reliability, controls have been added to the testing procedure. said Graham. This year's aides. Gay Kuemel. Dennis Wyat and Sharon Balcom,
