Allies Score Slight Gains **During Storms**

TOKYO, Saturday —(AP)

Allied troops hacked out slight gains at opposite ends of the rain - lashed Korean warfront Friday against dangerously rebuilding Red forc-

Little fighting took place on the whole 120-mile battleline. Americans surmised this meant a North Korean building during the lull for a new

offensive smash. A U.S. 8th Army spokesman said-the Red drive by 50,000 men on Taegu, main allied base on the central front, had "petered out," probably from lack of sup-plies and sufficient manpower for

the present. The Reds had pushed to within seven miles of Taegu before the U.S. first cavalry division and South Koreans broke the back of

General MacArthur's headquarters warned of a possible new offensive either in the southwest. north or east.

The buildup seemed greatest on southern coastal approaches to Pusan port, chief allied base in

In Masan port, 27 airline miles west of Pusan, allied authorities ordered removal of all civilians not needed in the war effort. This was a precautionary measure in the face of a reported offensive buildup to the west and threat of infiltration by Red agents ordered to stir up trouble among the 75,000 population. Five thousand were evacuated from Masan in the first batch





HOARDING, INFLATION, AND PRICE-FIXING Recently, prices have been advancing sharply. This price rise has caused numerous publicists, some prominent

It is true that world-wide experience shows the INFLATION is, indeed, a monstrous thing which has wrecked the economies of many nations, and which should be avoided as a pestilence. But those of our fellow citizens who are now raving about the present situation have not taken the trouble to see whether or not INFLA-TION is actually in our midst to-

In reality, inflation occurs only when the combined total of money and demand bank deposits increases faster than does the physical volume of trade. Official Government statistics show that, in May, 1950, (the last month for which data are available) our supply of money and demand deposits was only 3% larger than it was in May, 1949, while during this same twelve month period, the physical volume of industrial production in the nation ran-up 11%. Clearly, therefore, we are not, at present, being overwhelmed by onrushing inflation. It follows that prescribing the application to our economy of the remedies used to cure inflation is entirely inappro-

The fact remains, however, that, recently, prices have been running ip rapidly. Way? The answer is forward buying, accumulation by amilies, dealers, and manufacturers of added stocks of durable goods—a phenomenon popularly lescribed by the epithet "HOARD-ING." This accumulation has been made possible partly by economizing on purchases of perishable goods, partly by going into debt, but perhaps mainly by spending accumulated monetary savings. Temporarily, it has strengthened lemand without increasing supply -hence prices have risen-but INFLATION has been in no way

responsible for the price rise. In the popular mind, HOARD-ING is now being pictured as IN-FLATION'S twin ogre. The hue and cry against HOARDING has indeed grown to such huge proportions that the nation's dignified House of Representatives has actually been induced to pass a bill providing for the punishment of persons engaged in the villain-

ous practice of HOARDING. Undoubtedly, the consciences of those who have advocated or voted for such legislation will rest easier if they carefully avoid looking into the causes responsible for this forward buying. Just what has suddenly induced customers to begin laying in stocks of durable goods? Are they afraid that the relatively small army required to dispose of the North Koreans will absorb the superabundant supplies of raw materials and finished products now being turned out by our mines, farms, and factories? Of course not! Just why, then, are they "hoarding?"

It requires no more than a brief period of thoughtful consideration to make the answer obvious. People are storing away goods today for one reason only namely, that, but a few years back, they were victimized by a bureaucratic monstrosity known as the O.P.A., and because, under the guise of providing for a war emergency, Congress is now threatening to inflict once again nefarious price fixing and ration-

At the other extreme, proponents claim that army life will be an education for the youth. We doubt that, but even though it is true, what business has the army educating the youth. The business of the army is to defend the country and it will do that better if it has no sidelines in social experimentation.

The question to be resolved seems quite simple: Will universal military training give this country the best possible de-

The opinion of the army is perhaps preponderantly, but far from unanimously, in the affirmative and such opinion must carry considerable weight. Nevertheless, preponderant opinion is not to be trusted blindly; it is not right because it is preponderant.

It we were going out to staff a newspaper or a steel mill or what have you, we would not go out with a dragnet and bring in just anybody. We would have in mind what we wanted to do and we would select the people who seemed to us best able to perform the tasks assigned. 
