

But the Interstate Commerce Commission appears to be confident the final outcome will find any given kind of freight, of the same weight, moving the same distance anywhere in the United States, at about the same rate. What has to be done is to bring the traditionally higher rates in the South and West down into line with the tradi-

tionally lower rates in the East. As the ICC sees it, that means giving southern and western manufacturing, and business generally in those areas, the opportunity to compete on an equal fcoting with the East's longestablished industrial strength.

The commission, which has been wrestling with the problem 12 years, has just taken two additional long strides in the direction of national parity. In separate orders, the ICC

1. Ordered the railroads to complete and submit for approval within four months a new table of uniform classifications of freight, to be applied to every segment of the country. The carriers have been working on it for nearly six years.

2. Proposed a new territorial adjustment in the basic "class rates. applying principally to manufactured goods, to be applied everywhere east of the Rocky Mountains, on some future which remains to be set.

The projected uniform class rate scale would involve only very slight adjustments in the Bast, including some small actual reductions over very short distances, coupled with major slashes, ranging up to 15 percent, in the rates in the South and the states lying between the Mississippi River and the Rockies.

The proposed rate action specifically excludes the Pacific-Mountain states west of the Rockies for the present. The rate level in that territory continues under investigation.

Commission officials foresee two possibilities of further lengthy delays in finalizing the steps: The revised freight classifica-

tions will deal with some 20,000 different items shipped by rail. Many shippers and receivers of freight may not be happy about reclassification of items in which they have a direct interest. Under the law, they may pro

test, and if they do, the ICC must suspend action until the item involved is investigated and possibly made the subject of hearings. Several hundred such investigations may be required.

When the proposed new rate changes are actually ordered some railroads may find new grounds for throwing the whole matter again into litigation, which would have to go up to the Supreme Court.

The experts look to the West for a challenge because the carriers in that territory have had most of their suggestions for making the class rate adjustments turned down. The cry in the South and West

for an opportunity to get their products into populous markets on an equal footing with the highly industrialized northeastern states has been raised almost since the end of the Civil War.

Dr. Myron Prinzmetal said "several death was caused by cerebral vascular accidents." He said Hearst had "enjoyed robust health until approximately four years ago when he became sub-

ject to the ailments of advanced He passed away at 9:50 a.m. Tuesday.

His death closed a career of 65 years as a newspaper publisher. His spectacular career began when he took control of the San Francisco Examiner in 1886. It was then a small newspuber.

It was from this start that he built a newspaper chain that at its peak represented a \$200,000,enterprise.

A Much Needed Federal Ameridment

Congressman Raiph W. Gwinn from New York is one of the soundest men in Congress. He is not only sound, but he is fearless. He is a great educator, He knows the principles on which this govgovernment should be limited. On May 4, 1951, Congressman Gwinn introduced Joint Resolution

No. 252, proposing a Constitutional amendment to the United States limiting taxation for nonmilitary purposes. I want to quote from this Resolution:

"Joint resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to taxes and the national debt.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Con-stitution when ratifled by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States:
"Section I. All taxes levied and

collected for nonmilitary expendi-tures including interest on the national debt in any one year shall not exceed 5 percent of the na-tional income for the nearest preceding calendar year from which tigures are available; nonmilitary expenditures shall include all of those not defined as military expenditures.

"'The Congress shall define what constitutes military expenditures, which shall include only such outlave as are used for raising and maintaining personnel for Armed Forces and for the facilities and materials needed by them to be effective, and for benefits

and pensions to veterans.

"The Congress shall also define, according to accepted accounting practice, what consti-tutes national income.

"Sec. 2. To provide for the Military Establishment in peace-times, and to defray the costs of

war. The Congress shall lay and collect special war taxes. Sec. 3. The Congress shall from time to time lay and coffeet

a special tax to be used solely to retire the national debt. "'Sec. 4. The power of Congress defined in section 8, article I, of the Constitution to borrow mo on the credit of the United States is hereby limited to the power to borrow money when approved by a vote of the epople only to meet the needs of a state of war, or to meet a national emergency."

Congressman Gwinn explains that 5 percent of the national income would give the government about 10 billion dollars for the support of the nonmilitary part of the government. He explains that in 1950 nonmilitary expenditures approximated 21 billion dollars.

The government thus would have to cut its nonmilitary expenditures about 10 billion dollars. He explains the amendment in this man-The National Committee To

Limit Federal Taxing Powers supports this amendment. It believes this to be the most feasible remedy yet offered. "Government hand-outs are the

sure symptoms of communism. They are contagious. They foster corruption in Government, often under the guise of social welfare. The end result of this robbing-Peter - to - pay - Paul philosophy is higher taxes.
"If we limit the Federal Govern-

ment's power to impose taxes on the people, as we have done in the States and municipalities, we automatically curtail government spending. This has stopped even so-rialist mayors. If we withhold our rialist mayors. If we money, our officials cannot carry us into socialism or communism. This will enable our elected offigials to resist requests from those who clamor for more and bigger handouts. It will put method instead of madness in our present Government housekeeping. It will hasten the return of our Nation tary efficiency nor impair our destrengthen us at home and command respect among the other na-






