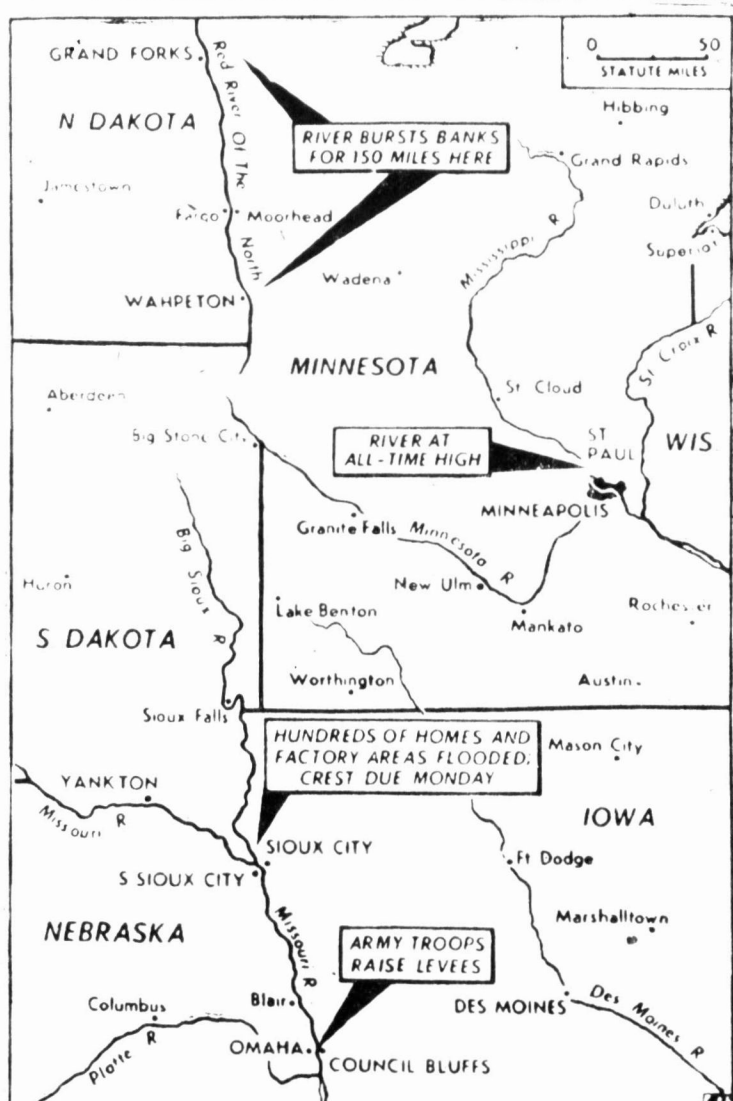

Flood Waters Of Missouri On Rampage

OMAHA, Neb., AP — The mad Missouri river threw everything it had — its record-breaking flood crest — at the Sioux City, Ia., area today and gave new intensity to the dramatic fight against water being waged in the downstream Omaha - Council Bluffs, Ia., area.

Downstream town after town was either prostrate or abandoned. But Omaha and Council Bluffs, whose combined metropolitan area takes in 350,000 persons, were fighting it out prepared for the worst but determined to forestall it.

This was the picture in the two cities. About two-thirds of Council Bluffs, 15,000 persons had either been pulled out of their homes. Across the river, in the East Omaha and Leake, Ia., areas, homes of perhaps 5,000 more were similarly deserted.

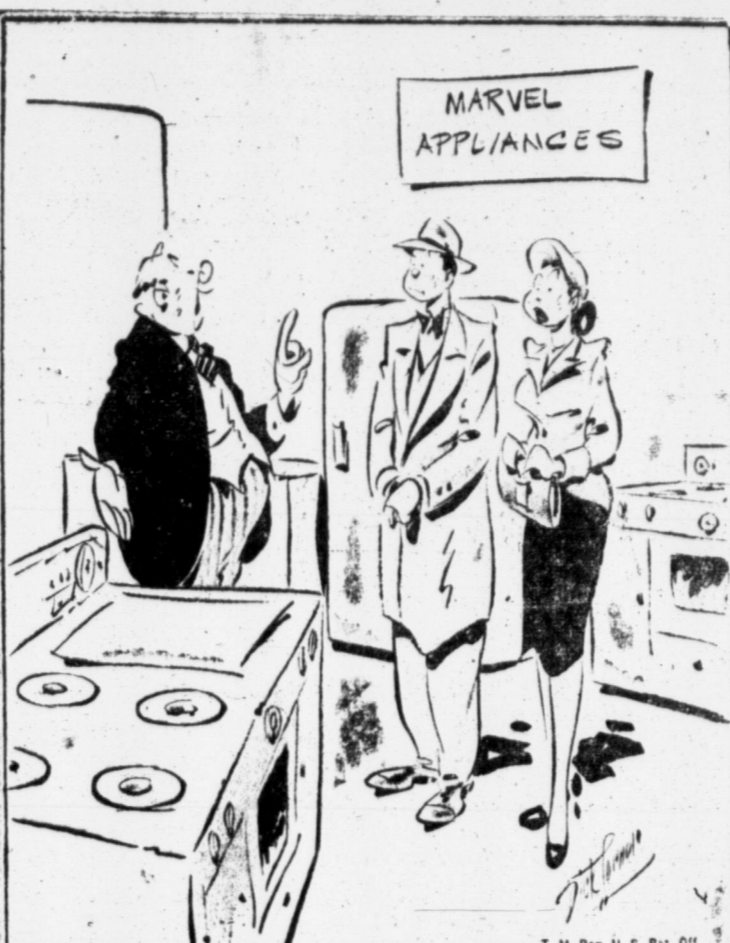

Budget Axe Hits Military Easy Living

WASHINGTON (AP) — Irate Senators aimed an axe today at plush living quarters, free servants, special trains, and other luxuries for U. S. military personnel in overseas posts. If the Pentagon fails to curtail "luxury living" by U. S. occupation forces in Germany, Sen. O'Mahoney (D-Wyo) told a reporter Congress will find a way to do it. O'Mahoney is presiding at closed-door Senate hearings on the multi-billion dollar annual defense money bill. He said he probably will offer an amendment calling for an end to free recreation centers for U. S. military forces in Germany. Two Republican members of the House, Sen. Ferguson of Michigan and Young of North Dakota, said in separate interviews they will support O'Mahoney. "The American taxpayers are paying the costs for all these civilian employees of the military in Germany and elsewhere either directly or indirectly," Young said. Young said he learned the armed forces in Japan had hired women secretaries in Australia and supplied them with free Japanese meals, quarters and transportation to and from Japan. He said free servants for both military and civilian workers in Japan ended last July 1. "Ferguson said extravagant living in occupied countries by our representatives is bad public relations" and "it also tends to soften up our armed forces."

Laborites Pull English Filibuster

LONDON (AP) — Filibustering Laborites threatened today to bog down Winston Churchill's whole legislative program unless his government drops its plans to charge fees for the state health service and repeal socialist state-ownership bills. Led by determined Aneurin Bevan, the Socialist forced the House to start the early morning hours for the third night in a row to debate amendments to the health service charges. The Laborites have offered 130 amendments. After three nights of increasingly angry argument, 115 of them still face the House. He specifically demanded the government also drop its bills to raise the steel industry and long distance truck lines back to private owners. Churchill earlier had quelled impatience among his conservative followers by promising quick action on these measures.

Election System Expose Written By Schoolteacher

DALLAS (AP) — When a Dallas schoolteacher thought he recognized in Texas a "growing sense of futility" about political machinations, he set out to write an expose of the election system. David S. Switzer's expose of the unsensational type in which he neither calls anyone names nor links any person to unpopular causes. In fact, his pamphlet, "Voting Responsibility," doesn't even deal with personalities. All he exposes is that Texas voters have a chance to do more than cast a ballot on election day, and then he tells them how. "Everybody thinks there isn't any chance to pick the people who run for office," Switzer says. He believes most voters think they have to sit back and wait for a candidate to be served up to them on a platter—tarnished by the hands of professional politicians. "Then they go out and vote and think they've been good citizens," he adds, expressing a bit of futility himself. So in his book Switzer says he has tried to open the door—a door he says political profiteers have closed and locked tight—to the election system. Briefly (in 30 some pages) and graphically (with nearly 20 cartoons, graphs and charts) Switzer explains how an election proceeds, from the neighborhood precinct election May 3 to the general election in November. The neighborhood precinct election is the clue to Switzer's argument. This is the place where he thinks "the people" fall down. Until they start using the precinct meetings and elections as a lever, they'll never wrest control of tickets, parties and governments from the boys in the smoke-filled rooms, he points out. It's the "grassroots" way, he says, and "you and your neighbors are the grassroots." Switzer's booklet is the second low-cost one he's done in a series he calls Citizenship Responsibility. His first book was a presentation of Texas' motor vehicle inspection laws passed by the last state legislature. His series is not the first crack at writing Switzer has taken. Although he has been a teacher in the Dallas Public Schools for nearly 20 years, he has taken time out for writing textbooks and newspaper features. He is co-author of "Fundamentals of Citizenship," the standard Texas textbook for eighth grade civics classes. Another book, "Self Government by Texans," was written before the Citizenship Responsibility series began. Features, combining educational and entertainment ideas were written by Switzer for the Dallas Morning News during the last war. He has also worked for the Associated Press in its Dallas Bureau.

On the west coast, planes from the British carrier Jory struck hard at Communist troops and gun positions.

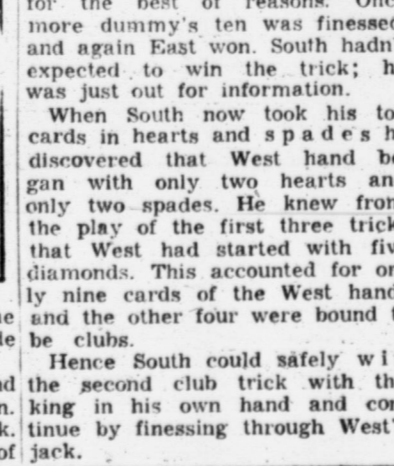

**Floors Need Refinishing?
 Here's How To Do It**

 Because the beds are out of season, the floor should be floors most of the time now, why waxed with either liquid rubbering or do something about the condition of hardwood floors which have taken a beating through the winter.

In most cases, best results are achieved by completely refinishing floors. In cases where the existing finish is floor wax or lacquer, it may only be necessary to touch up worn spots with the same type of finish. If the worn spots are conspicuous because of their size or number, it's better to refinish the entire room.

Before applying a new finish, the floor must be clean. This means not only sweeping it but removing all dirt and wax.

There are several cleaning agents which are recommended: general sprays or ammonia may be purchased at most paint stores. A damp cloth with mild soap can be used.

To remove grease spots, use a laundry soap containing lye but only on a small area at a time and immediately rinse and dry it off. In the case of particularly stubborn areas where the ammonia, general sprays or soap do not work, rub the area with steel wool.

Be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions. If you use the same type of finish, one coat is usually sufficient. If you wish to change the type of finish it will be necessary to completely remove the old finish from the wood except in one place where varnish can be applied over shell.

**Mr. And Mrs. Ralph Essof Seek
 'Coziness' In Their New Home**

 The Ralph Essofs, newcomers to Pampa from Michigan, live at 1524 N. Coffee. Their new modern design home has rose-brown, asbestos shingled siding and trim to match. The Essofs like a "cozy" home and have attained this by use of bright wall paper, floral upholstery and many unique pieces which were used for decoration.

The large living room in the more than 1100 square-foot floor space house has muted, light green painted walls with darker shade of green used in the tiered drapes at the window groupings. Ceiling is white with a slight cast of green. One chair is green with the majority of the other furniture upholstered in prints that repeat color-tone of walls and drapes or provide bright contrast.

Hanging Shelf
 Two floor lamps have plain taffeta shades. Well used for extra decorative touches are pine hanging shelf and antique oak comb shelf that are reminiscent of earlier days. Two table lamps have white shades over bases of what once were kerosene lamps with onyx bases.

Featured in the dining room is an unusual cornice board over the double window. Painted red to match the print in wallpaper the cornice has a shelf on top where Mrs. Essof displays some of her antique collection. The wallpaper is a print, Waverly Exclusive, and a companion print of glazed chintz is used in the draw drapes. There is a Drexel pine dropleaf table and hutch teamed with a large oval braided rug. Completing the "cozy" room is a copper hanging light fixture.

Favorite Room
 One of Mrs. Essof's favorite rooms is the kitchen, papered in a gay print of roosters and barns on a brown background. A wainscoting of sand blasted pine with oak stain, blends with the yellow morlite and formal kitchen pieces. A trivet lamp on the west wall over the breakfast table has added decorative touch by use of four small iron trivets hung on either side. A movable pine glass cupboard backs the stove and provides a divider for eating and cooking area. The light fixture has a cherry-red bob-nail bottom and the ceiling is painted chinese red to match barns and house tops in paper. Copper molds hung over counter top of the cabinet is a sparkling decoration and is easily accessible for use. White organdy curtains are trimmed with a lime-green ruffle. A dutch door leads to the utility room.

Guest Room
 The guest room is small so decoration was employed to give appearance of "roominess." Print paper with blue background was used for wainscoting and walls and ceiling were painted a light blue. An all-white chest matches wood part of the blue upholstered headboard of bed. On the chest is set an antique cold water pitcher and basin, part of a complete set. Tiered curtains are a large plaid predominantly blue and on the floor is an oval braided rug. In the guest room, like the dining room and master bedroom is a chair rail.

Landscaping is not yet completed but Mrs. Essof plans many flowers. A couple of trees will be planted in the front yard. The back yard will be completely fenced and bordered in flowers. To the south of the back door Mr. Essof plans a cement patio where a large outside table will be situated. Flowers will be planted on either side of the back porch.

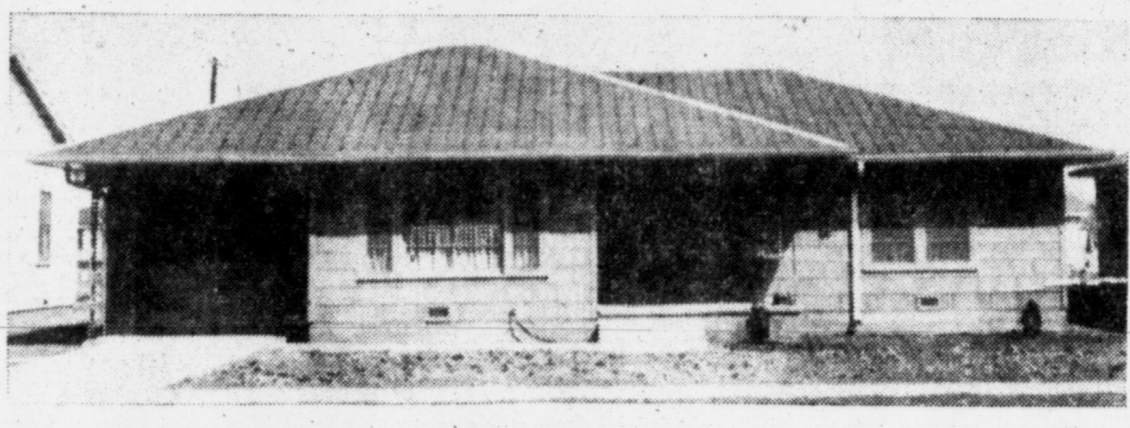
Mrs. Essof made the curtains throughout the house and hand-painted up a right old-fashioned iron used for decoration in the kitchen.

The Essof home was built by contractor J. D. Lard.

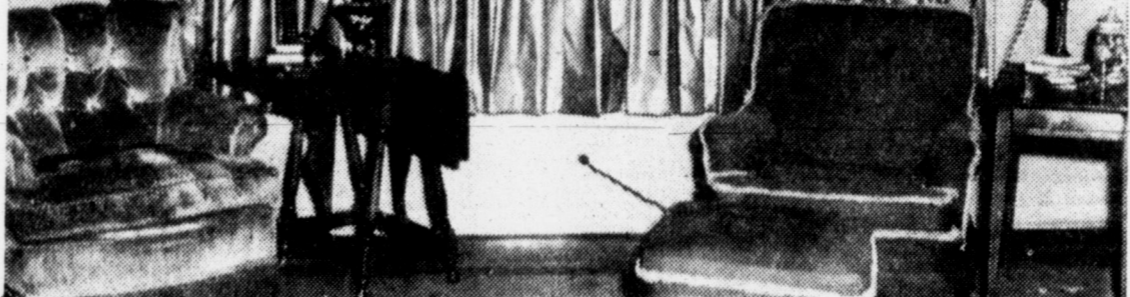
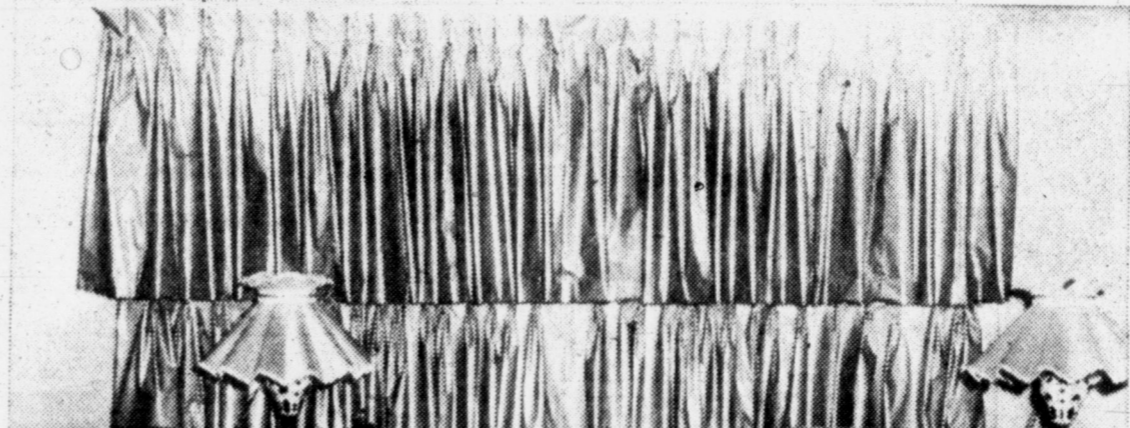
Chase Moisture For Nicer Interior
 Hot running water, steam from cooking, and various modern appliances add moisture to home interiors.

 Roller coaters, used for applying paint to flat wall and ceiling surfaces, come in lengths that vary from two to nine inches. The seven-inch one is usually most popular.

Avoid Dust

Needs Tight Cover

Mr. Fix: Fix Asphalt Roof Leaks

 Now that quick freezes and thaws have been erased from the weather picture, some asphalt shingled roofs show signs of having suffered from winter's sting. You will want to repair them before the heavy rains come.

Simple leaks in an asphalt roof can be fixed in just a few minutes with asphalt roofing cement. If the hole is a small one, all you have to do is lift the edge of the shingle, apply the asphalt over the hole with a trowel and press the shingle down again.

If the shingle is torn, coat the underside along the tear and press it down. Drive roofing nails through on each side of the tear and paint them as well as the tear with more asphalt. If the shingle is loose and flapping, paste it down in the same manner.

If a shingle is worn beyond repair from tree limbs or any other objects rubbing against it, you should replace the shingle. Lift the shingle, remove any nails possible and very carefully cut the worn shingle out. Put a new one in its place, nail it down if possible, paint the nail heads with asphalt and otherwise secure it with cement.

If you find it necessary to replace the entire roof, check carefully for warped boards and nail them down. Remove and replace or hammer down loose nails, then sweep the roof clean.

You may have had the same unfortunate experience last winter that Mr. Fix had with water backing up from clogged and frozen gutters. The water ran down inside the window frames and stained the wallpaper. To stop this condition, lay a strip of roll roofing under the shingles along the lower edge of the roof for the length of the gutter. Place it under the shingles at least a foot above the point where the inside of the wall meets the roof and let a quarter-inch of roofing protrude from under—the roof's edge.

In covering an old asphalt-shingled roof with a new material you can be guided by the old shingle line, but if you have removed an old roof preparatory to installing asphalt shingles, you should snap chalk lines at intervals as an aid to uniformity.
