4-H members participate in Co 4-H Food Show

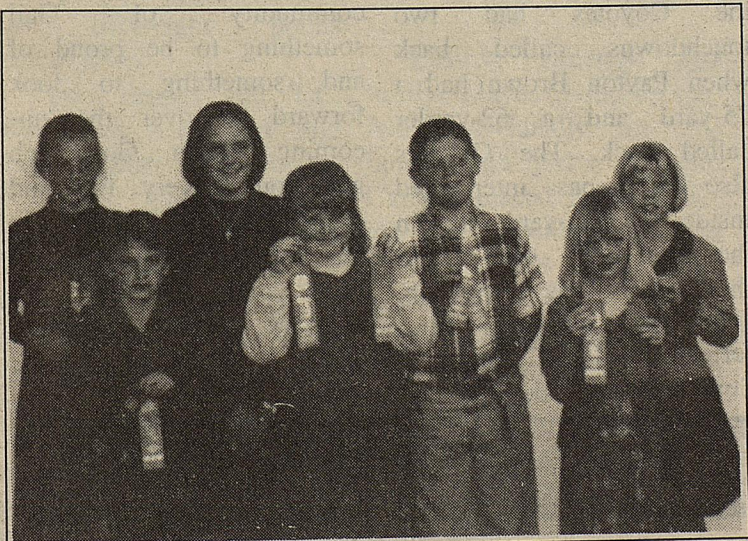
4-H'ers have been involved in the 4-H Food and Nutrition project since the middle of September. Participants have learned about nutrition, food safety and basic food preparation skills. Project leaders were Julie Mumme, Beth Stamper and Ollie Holmes. Participants also went on a tour to the United Supermarket in Snyder, which was very informative and a lot of fun.

Food & Nutrition project members had the opportunity to compete in the Borden County 4-H Food Show. This allows the youth to select and prepare a dish in one of four categories (main dish, breads and cereals, fruits

and vegetables, and nutritious snacks) and compete in one of three age categories (junior I, junior II and senior). The youth are also required to answer questions about their dish, as well as questions about nutrition (the Food Guide Pyramid and nutrients in their dish).

The county food show was held on Monday, October 18th in the Community Building. The following 4-H'ers competed: J. Ryan Gicklhorn, Junior II - Nutritious Snack (first place); Lindsey Stamper, Junior I - Main Dish (second place); Kalli Poole, Junior I - Main Dish (first place); Jake Cooley, Junior

The Borden County JV Coyotes hosted the Ira Bulldogs Thursday with the hopes of completing a perfect season at 9 wins and 0 losses. This was a feat that is believed to have never happened on the Junior Varsity level in school history. With a varsity improving offense, the Coyotes wasted little time in assuring themselves of a history making evening. They took only two plays to come up with their first score of the evening as tailback, Raul Rodriguez busted loose on

a 43-yard touchdown run, scored to cut the Coyotes Payton Brown kicked the lead to 16-6.

On the next series, the Coyotes needed only a few plays as Raul Rodriguez used the good blocking of Cody Nowlain, Talin Pepper, Rowdy Dunlap, Tanner Poole, Brionne Jackson and Payton Brown to bust loose on a 54-yard run. Coyotes Clinch Play-Off Spot

The Borden County Coyotes clinched a play-off spot for the fourth year in a row last Friday in Ira by shutting out the Bulldogs 40-0. The win clinches the runner-up spot for the Coyotes with one game remaining on the district schedule. The Coyotes are now 3-1 in district play, with 1-3 Hermleigh yet to play.

This is a very tough district, and no team can afford to let up on any given week. Hermleigh is a good football team and the Coyotes will have to play ball and not take them lightly.

The Coyotes definitely did not take Ira for granted. The game was certainly tougher than the score indicates. The Coyotes had a great night on both sides of the ball. The Coyotes stingy defense gave up only 181 yards of total offense. The Coyote offense amassed 403 total yards of offense. The Coyotes rushed the ball 40 times for 307 yards. We completed 7 of 9 passes for 96 yards. The Coyote defense allowed only 69 rushing yards on 19 carries. The Bulldogs completed 12 of 26 passes for 112 yards. The Coyotes intercepted 2 Bulldog PAT was missed, and the score read 32-0.

The Coyotes put their last score on the board early in the fourth period as Ed Rodriguez ran it in from the five. He then kicked the PAT good to produce the final score, 40-0.

Ed Rodriguez led the Coyote offense with 20 carries for 229 yards and 4 touchdowns. He caught 3 passes for 48 yards, and he

was two for two passing the ball for 25 yards. Defensively, Ed harassed the quarterback all evening. He had 9 tackles, one sack, 5 quarterback hurries, and one fumble recovery.

Joseph Hardman carried the ball 8 times for 33 yards and two touchdowns. He caught two passes for 32 yards, and he had 7 tackles on defense.

Kevin Pinkerton carried the ball 7 times for 45 yards and he caught a pass for 5 yards. Kevin completed 5 of 7 passes for 71 yards. He had 11 tackles on defense, broke up two passes, recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass.

Tom Griffin had 5 tackles and an interception from the safety position. passes and threw an interception. The Coyotes lost one fumble and the Bulldogs lost two. The Coyotes were penalized 9 times for 55 yards, while the Bulldogs were penalized 6 times for 50 yards. The Coyotes did not punt and the Bulldogs punted twice for an average of 33 yards.

Joseph Hardman scored the first two touchdowns for the Coyotes by diving into the end zone from the one-yard line each time. Ed Rodriguez scored the third Coyote TD with just :49 seconds left in the first quarter to make the score 18-0 in favor of the Coyotes. All three point after attempts were missed.

The Coyotes were held scoreless in the second quarter, but found a way to start moving the ball late in the third quarter. Ed Rodriguez ran the ball over from the two-yard line and then kicked the

PAT good to take a 26-0 lead.

Kevin Pinkerton came up with a big interception to spoil the Bulldogs' next drive at the Coyotes 2-yard line. On the next play Ed Rodriguez followed good blocks by Joseph Hardman and Kevin Pinkerton run to 78 yards for a touchdown.

Ramon Griffin snapped the ball from center offensively and had 11 tackles on defense.

Nick Flanigan played offensive end and had a big catch for an 11-yard gain.

Robert Stamper made four tackles on defense from the safety position.

Dale Grant had two tackles and two quarterback hurries.

T.J. Sharp had 3 tackles and broke up a pass.

The final score of this contest could have actually been a little different, as the Coyotes had two touchdowns called back when Payton Brown had a 75-yard and a 62-yarder called back. The Coyotes also had a pass intercepted inside the ten-yard line in the first half. All in all, this contest was completely dominated by the now perfect Borden County JV Coyotes. The defense of

Rowdy Dunlap, Cody Nowlain, Talin Pepper, T.C. Stipe, James Bond, Raul Rodriquez and Payton Brown again flexed their muscles, as they held a very explosive Bulldog offense to only 22 points as they have been very impressive all season long.

Cody Nowlain completed his first pass of his career for a touchdown, and had a 20-yard run. Payton Brown had 156-yards on only 10 carries. Raul Rodriquez had 12 carries for 169 yards. Rowdy Dunlap had two catches for 19 yards and Brionne Jackson hit 2 of 4 passes for 19 yards.

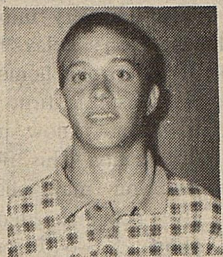

District Cross Country Results Girls Win Gold, Boys Take Silver

The Borden County varsity girls placed first, and the varsity boys finished second at the District 9-A meet at Air Park in Big Spring on Saturday, qualifying both teams for the regional meet. The weather was cold and very windy.

Five Borden County varsity girls earned individual medals by finishing in the top ten places. Holly Thomas led the way, winning the silver medal by covering the 1.90-mile course in a time of 13:47. She was followed by Bobbie Kempf' fourth place finish in 13:59. Julie Mayes placed fifth with a time of 14:16, Dalene Kempf finished seventh with a time of 14:18, and Micah Hensley claimed the tenth spot with a time of 14:36. Bekah Hensley and Shaina Isaacs both finished in the top twenty. The girls won the district meet with an astounding twenty points. Second place finisher Sands was thirty-eight points behind them, and third place finisher Dawson was fifty-eight points behind them.

Trent Pepper and T.C. Stipe took the gold and silver medals, respectively, in the varsity boy's division. Trent finished the five-kilometer course in 16:44. T.C., continuing to show that he is one of the best runners in the region, covered the course in 17:52. Medallist Robert Stamper placed a solid tenth finished in a time of

19:51. Payton Brown, Cody Nowlain, and Talin Pepper all finished in the top twenty. The boys scored twenty-nine points, narrowly missing the district championship by two points. District Champion Sands had twenty-seven points.

The Borden County junior varsity girls had five individual medallists. Silver medallist Crystal Dye finished the 1.9-mile course in 15:45. Hailey Adcock brought home the bronze medal with a time of 15:50. Patti Rodriguez placed fifth in 16:48, and Kaci Poole placed sixth in 17:05. Carolina Arellanos was the seventh runner to cross the line, finishing in 17:06. Michele Bond was the final medallist of the girls, placing eighth in 17:14. Other members of the junior varsity girl's team were Adrianna Baeza and Amanda Watts.

Kevin Pinkerton brought home the gold medal in the junior varsity boy's division.

Cassidy Rinehart and Emily Mayes both medallied individually in the junior high girl's division. Cassidy placed fifth, covering the 1.5-mile course in 9:58. Emily was close behind in 10:07, placing tenth. Other members of the Junior High girl's team were Thelma Balague, Shayla Gass, and Ashley Ellison.

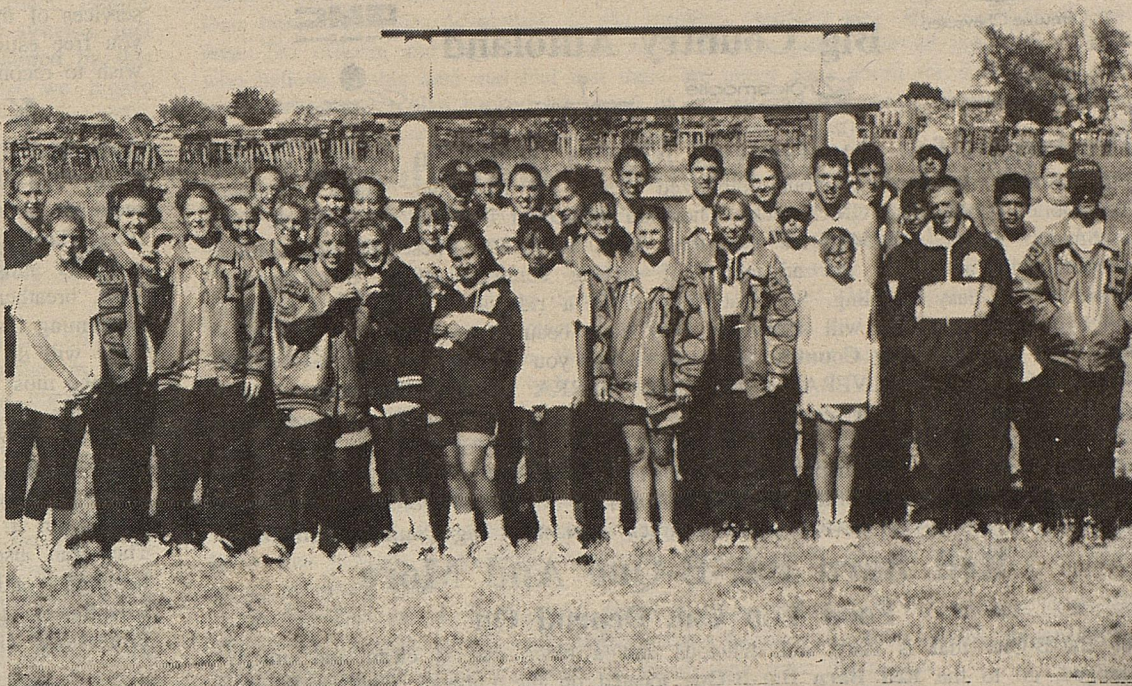
Medallist Evan Wine-

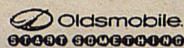

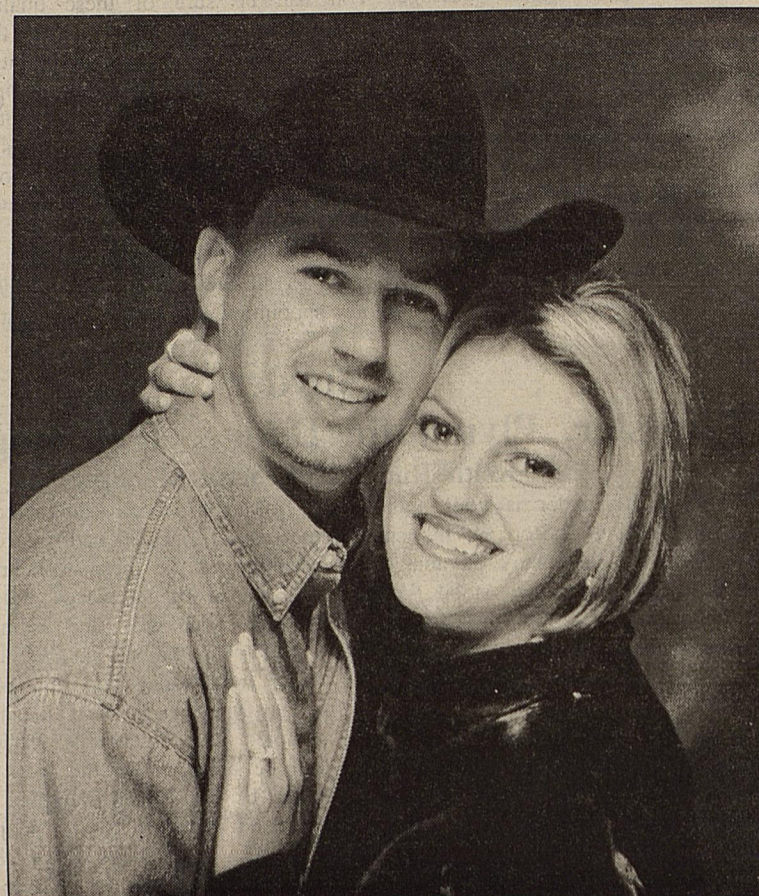

Cattle A.I. and Pregnancy Determination School Scheduled in Big Spring

American Breeders Service will offer a 4-day A.I. and pregnancy determination school in Big Spring on December 7-10. Participants will receive daily hands-on training with live cattle. In addition, each morning of the course will be devoted to in-depth classroom instruction and discussion led by ABS personnel and a Texas A&M Extension Livestock Specialist. Topics will include: Cow and heifer management, nutrition, sire selection, and heat detection and synchronization. Pre-registration and a \$150 dollar deposit is required by December 1. 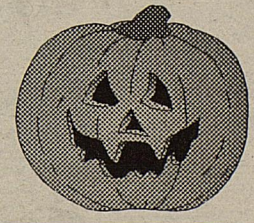

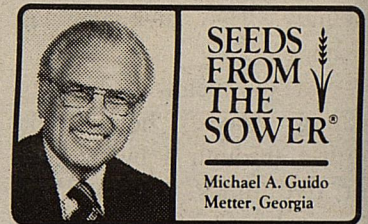

A Champion Eater

Glenn Bumgardner of Tyler weighed less than three pounds when he was born. When his mother left the hospital, the doctor gave her three bottles of formula and told her Glenn would probably not finish them within a week. But the three bottles of formula were all gone before the baby got home. "Mother says I've been going strong ever since," says Glenn, who now weighs 330 pounds. His nickname is T-bone.

At the peak of his big eating days, he would cruise through a buffet four or five times. "I could eat a whole pan of rolls with a meal," says Glenn. "My mother made cinnamon rolls for breakfast every morning and the wonderful smell made me want to get out of bed and go to the kitchen."

When he was in college, he and some fraternity brothers went to New Orleans for Mardi Gras. There was a national pizza eating contest going on and Glenn's friends urged him to enter. The object was to see who many pizzas a person could eat in one hour.
