Church Groups Against Plan

WASHINGTON - (AP)Slashing attacks on universal military training (UMT) by leaders of church groups left Chairman Russell (D -Ga.) of the Senate Armed Services committee — as he put it - "frankly puzzled" today.

Most church witnesses bitterly assail the proposal to compel 18years olds to take six months' basic military training but say they are willing to go along with the selective service draft for several more years.

Russell is a sponsor of the UMT measure. He hopes it eventually can replace the draft by building up a vast reservoir of manpower in the re

Remember that letter Eleanor Roosevelt wrote to Undersecretary 1939? And on a White House letterhead at that. She wrote:

"Dear Sumner: All these papers were brought to me vesterday by a friend of Mr. Eisler. The man who brought them is a perfectly honest person and very much disturbed. He thinks the State Department has really told the Cuban Consul that they do not wish to admit the Eislers and he is perfectly sure that the Eislers are not communists and have no political affiliations of any kind. He is sure that they believe our form of Government is 'heaven' and would be entirely agreeable without reservation to take an oath of allegiance.

"I believe that . . . the Labor Department did not examine the case carefully enough. Why not do it all over again and bring it out in the open and let the Eislers detend themselves? Cordially, Eleanor Roosevelt.'

That was the letter which got the Eislers into the United States. The Labor Department HAD investigated the Eislers and recommended against their being admitted to this country. So Eleanor got busy and went to her close friend in the State Department to have the Labor Department overruled. Just why she was so wild to get the Eislers into the country is Of course the Eislers have long since been exposed and have es-



what can be done about it. This condition is known medically as schizophrenia, and was formerly often , called dementia praecox. It is one of the most important of the mental diseases, and it has been stated that approximately every fourth patient who occupies a hospital bed in the United States is afflicted with this

Furthermore, unlike some of the mental diseases, schizophrenia is most likely to strike in late adolescence or early adult life, and thus prevents persons in the prime of life from taking their part satisfactorily in society.

Schizophrenia comes more often in children born of parents who inherited and present in the environmen

and may come on slowly or suddenly. Among the signs which may develop early are disorderliness, or lack of cleanliness in personal affairs. Some victims of the disease appear to be unduly suspicious or feel they are being persecuted.

Changes in thinking and judgment, stealing, and other alterations in behavior which perhaps may not be constant raise the suspicion of the presence of this dis-

It is believed that early diagnosis offers the best hope for recovery. After diagnosis the usual choice of treatment is either psy-

Either of these may bring about incumbents will have to excellent results. Reserved for patients who do not respond well to such forms of treatment are such operations on the brain as lobotomy, which sometimes can be tried when other methods have failed. "On the other side of the coin the least we owe to this young man in advance is a clear understanding of our problems, aims and, plans, with the assurance sacrifice will cease the instant the necessity passes. (Pittsburgh, October, 1949.)

The estimated tax -Several million people, includ-

pay-as-you-go basis as possible. So for these people March 15, 1952, is a double tax deadline. By that date they must: 1. File a return on their 1951

income tax and pay in full any

2. And they must also file an estimate on what their 1952 income will be, and what the estimated tax on it will be. (This is called "declaration of estimated tax.") And when they file that return by March 15 they must start paying the first of four quarterly installments on what that estimated tax is. The other installments are due June 15, Sept. 15 and Jan. 15, 1953.

The wage-earners in this group the tax withheld from their pay and the full tax they figure they'll owe for the year. Others with no tax withheld, will have to estimate their income and their full tax and pay quarterly installments on it.

Remember: the income tax in 1952 is higher than the tax on 1951 income. So in figuring the 1952 tax you won't be able to use the table or the tax rates that you used in figuring your

Instead

you must use a spe - called 1040-ES cial form printed in green ink. On the back is the new tax table for people with under \$5000 income and the new tax rates for people with income of \$5000 or more (But you can use Form 1040, which was your return for 1951, as a guide in using 1040-ES. The methods used on both are the same. It's the tax rates which are different on the two forms.)

On the back of that Form 1040-Es is a pretty detailed explanation of who must use it to file a declaration of estimated

In trying to decide whether you must file this estimate, be sure to exclude from your estimated 1952 income any income which is tax-free, like social sebenefits and benefits under the Railroad Retirement

Also, in using 1040-ES, you claim all the exemptions and deductions to which you're entitled. Previous stories in this series explained the 1951 rules on exemptions and deductions. They're inchanged in 1952. Head of household -

In previous years Congress gave married couples a break over single people by letting husbands and wives file joint returns through which they can split their income to get a lower

But some people — either un-married or legally separated — run a household, with household expenses as large as those of married couples. Until now Congress overlooked them. Starting in 1952 they get a

break. They will in most cases be taxed a little less than single persons who are not heads of a household but a little higher than married couples. Under the new law, passed last

fall, you are a "head of house-1. You are unmarried or legally separated.

2. You furnish more than half the maintenance of your home which is your principal residence in 1952 and which you share 3. Any person for whom you

are entitled to an exemption, like your mother or father or broth-

4. Any person who is your un-married child, grandchild or stepchild, even though that child has income and can't be claimed as a dependent by you.

If you fit the rule for head of household and have to file an estimated tax return for 1952 you'll find your tax in the table on the back of Form 1040-ES or


