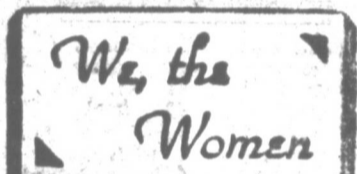

1st AA Elimination Round This Weekend

Clear-cut favorites pushed forward today in seven of the eight games that will send the Texas schoolboy football race into its quarter-final round.

The only battle in which the critics were undecided was the week's feature contest—Sunset vs. Paschal at Dallas.

This will be the only game matching undefeated teams. It also will be the lone tilt in which there is no direct comparison of strength. The reason is that Sunset played in the district that had no outside games. In that district—the Dallas section—Sunset won nine games and tied one.

Paschal on the other hand played fairly well-balanced schedule with teams from other areas while seeing up honors in the Fort Worth district. The Panthers swept through undefeated and untied, rolling up 244 points to 20 for the position.

The eight games this week are being played in equal number of Friday and Saturday. The schedule with the starting time and the favorites:

Friday—Greenville at Highland Park, Dallas, 2:30 p.m., Highland Park favored; Waco at Breckenridge, 2:30 p.m., Waco top favorite; Lufkin at Marshall, 2:30 p.m., Lufkin favored; Austin at McAllen, 7 p.m., Austin outstanding favorite.

Saturday—Wichita Falls at Amarillo, 2:30 p.m., Amarillo favored; Austin (El Paso) at San Angelo, 2:30 p.m., San Angelo heavy favorite; Paschal (Fort Worth) at Sunset (Dallas), 3 p.m., toss-up; Lamas (Houston) at Fort Arthur, 3:15 p.m., Fort Arthur heavy favorite.

Just four teams reached the first round of the state play-off will be unbeaten records. Paschal, Waco and Austin were undefeated and untied while Sunset has been tied but not defeated. However, none of these four occupies the favored spot of the San Angelo Bobcats, who lost an early season game to Lubbock and were held to a one-touchdown victory over Amarillo but haven't come close to dropping a contest since. In fact, the Bobcats look as strong if not stronger than the 1943 San Angelo team that swept to the state title.

San Angelo has scored 399 points while giving the opposition 20 in ten games.

Waco's record is most impressive of the other 15 teams. The Tigers scoring 380 points to 44 in their all-victorious march, beat such fine teams as Marshall, Highland Park and Temple.

Wacky Season In SW Conference; Underdog's Year

The 1944 Southwest conference football race goes into the books today as a triumph of the underdog.

There have been stranger fields and campaigns just as close but none more interesting and few so erratic.

Texas Christian's Horned Frogs, who had been taking Hopkins for a half-dozen years, surged to first place with a fighting team that made up for lack of ability with its battle when the chips were down.

The race ended with victory for an underdog as Southern Methodist came out of the dark cellar regions to topple the champions.

Pice, the team that was supposed to give Texas its hardest fight in the title race, finished in a tie for last place with Texas A. and M. and Rice and tied champion Texas Christian to finish the highest of any teamback outfit in seven years.

Attendance at most schools was up substantially compared to last season and the brand of football was generally higher.

Texas A. and M. led in most everything except victories. The Aggies rolled up 2927 yards rushing and passing in 10 games. Second in offense was Pice with 2613 yards while Arkansas was third with 2376. Texas Christian fourth with 2083. Texas fifth with 1935 and Southern Methodist last with 1925.

This is a good indication that statistics are worth little in football. Champion Texas Christian is fourth, second place Texas is fifth, while A. and M., which is tied for the cellar, is tops. Only Arkansas and Southern Methodist justified their statistical positions. Arkansas finished third, Southern Methodist last.

Rice led in ground gains with 1894 yards in 11 games. The Aggies averaged 184 in 10 tilts. The aerial leader was Arkansas with 1158 yards. Here again was a surprise. Arkansas wasn't supposed to do anything except mope on the ground, yet it led the conference in passing.

Only one game is to be played before the football season will be at an end for the Southwest. A. and M. meets Miami university at Miami Friday night.

It will be a long time before things settle down. Nations will be bankrupt and whole economies will be disorganized. Millions of men will be discharged from prison camps, many of them homeless. Pampa GI Expresses in Letter to News Feelings of Americans at the Front

Many Pampans and other county men now in service, men whom the most of our readers have known merely as Americans, write their war-time feelings to The Pampa News. Often these letters are quite expressive of the real sentiment of America. They make one feel that those men at the front really feel what they are fighting for. Such letters come from Sgt. S. J. Malveira, who is now in the European theater of operations. Most Pampans—and especially baseball fans—will recall him. He played with the Pampa Oilers when the Texas-New Mexico League was still active—before the war-struck.

We know that he is somewhere beyond Holland (that's the last place he was permitted to mention when the letter was written) and perhaps is taking part in the inter-ethnic fighting at this moment raging on the borders of Germany. In his letter he talks of the things he has seen, "gathering experiences, along the way—a few rough ones." "The thing that impressed me most," he continues, "with considerable emotion for what most of the people in England and here in Europe have been through, and also with deep sympathy for what they have and don't have—the things that impressed me most—and I consider it somewhat of a selfish thought—is that the environment of our American life by the very best of them all. XXXXX Our most potent desire—and I'm sure all of us—is to find ourselves soon battling again—and this time against Hitler. It is in the luxuries of our own American way of living."

In regard to the thoughts and feelings of those the Allied armies are fighting from the "Master" Race, he shows his appreciation for other peoples: "To see and feel the kindness, the generosity, the thoughtfulness and the consideration many of these people are bestowing upon us in expression for their gratitude to the Allied armies for getting back to them their long lost freedom is something hard for me and other GIs to explain, but easy for us to feel and to appreciate."

Big Price Paid For Day Comedy

No, these foxhole scholarships by which so many soldiers have tutored themselves in everything from electronics to philosophy, are strictly GI—that is, they are paid for out of moneys earmarked for the welfare of enlisted men, and army is very watchful that nobody else, including the veterans, gets any of it. You won't even be allowed to finish a course you are pursuing when discharged. NO FEE CHARGED Q. May I put a fee for having a claim presented before the veterans' administration? A. Organizations which veterans' administration recognizes for presentation of claims (American Red Cross, American Legion, Disabled Veterans, Grand Army of the Republic, United Spanish War Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars) must state that neither they nor their representatives will charge a fee. In order to prevent the pension and claim attorney rackets which thrived after the last war, VA rules also that attorneys acting for veterans' claims must be specifically certified, and must accept as their fee an appropriate amount awarded by VA out of amount given to claimant.
