Believe Polio Peak Reached

AUSTIN (AP) — Another week of polio well below the year's peak, bringing predictions from state health officials that the dread disease is leveling off. The State Health Department counted 163 new cases in Texas last week, just one more than in the week previous and sharply below the 214 cases of two weeks previous. The new tally brought the year's total to 3,109. State Health Officer George W. Cox said it was a record year that "need not be repeated." He predicted the polio toll could be cut in half in future years with sufficient working capital.

"I base this prediction on the fact that we know what causes polio and how it is spread. We need resources to put our knowledge to work," he said. Polio stabbed into three new counties — Collingsworth, Deaf Smith and Moore — during the week ending last Saturday. It is this year to 180.

Counties reported new cases as follows: Harris and Potter, 20 each; Dallas, 13; Lubbock, 12; Hale, 11; Bexar, 10; McLennan, 7; Jefferson, 5; Galveston and Tom Green, 4 each; Midland, Nueces, Collingsworth and Runnels, 3 each; Brazoria, Ector, Edwards, Floyd, Kelberg, Tarrant, Taylor, Victoria, and Deaf Smith 2 each.

Finishing Touches Being Made To Final Unit Of U. N. Home

UNITED NATIONS N. Y. (AP)—Workers are putting final touches on an odd-looking building which soon will become one of New York's leading show places.

This is the General Assembly Hall, third and last unit of the glittering U. N. Headquarters along the city's East River. The other two are the 39-story glass skyscraper and the 20-story marble skyscraper which houses the secretariat, and the plus Conference Building.

From the outside, the Assembly Hall is chiefly notable for its unusual shape: it has a sloping double convex roof topped by a shallow dome. The inside? Well, one visitor described it as a cross between a cathedral and Radio City Music Hall.

The spacious, high-ceilinged interior, with its slanted light-white walls, modern blue and gold decor of the auditorium itself is more like the latest thing in theatrical splendor.

Perhaps the most impressive spot in the entire headquarters is the public entrance where the U. N. expects to admit visitors by the thousands both to attend meetings and for sight-seeing.

This is where the ceiling is highest—supported on slender pillars and where the specially designed glass panels painted to look like marble from the outside—contribute a cathedral-like lighting.

The auditorium is 380 feet long and 160 feet wide. It has 636 seats for delegations at its ends on the main floor and its galleries will accommodate 800 visitors and 231 newsmen. There also are glass-enclosed booths built into the dome for the press, radio and television.

In addition to the main auditorium, the new building has a large conference room where the assembly's 60-nation Political Committee will hold its debates. This also has elaborate facilities for the public and the press.

Although the hall will be ready when the Assembly meets Oct. 14, there still is much to do before the 18-acre headquarters site is finally in its permanent shape. Much of the landscaping work still is in progress both on the approaches to the site and on the plaza which flanks the area between 42nd and 48th streets; eventually there may be another skyscraper at the northern end of the U. N. plot. This building would provide offices for delegations, if the U. N. finally decides to erect it.

The headquarters buildings have cost 69 million dollars exclusive of the land. The land cost approximately 10 millions with the remainder. The city also has spent about 27 million in altering and improving the approaches.

Jews Fight Conscription Of Women

JERUSALEM (AP)—The Shofar (Hebrew for ram's horn) was sounded at a number of synagogues in Jerusalem recently to drive away what religious-orthodox Jews here regard as "the evil spirit of deadly sin and danger."

Little Hope For Solution To National Emergency Strikes

WASHINGTON (AP)—There is little hope for a way out of national emergency strikes.

This presidential campaign isn't likely to provide a solution, Gov. Stevenson says so in his Labor Day speech.

He said that Taft-Hartley Act should be entirely replaced by a new labor law. He raised the question of handling national emergency strikes.

He offered several suggestions:

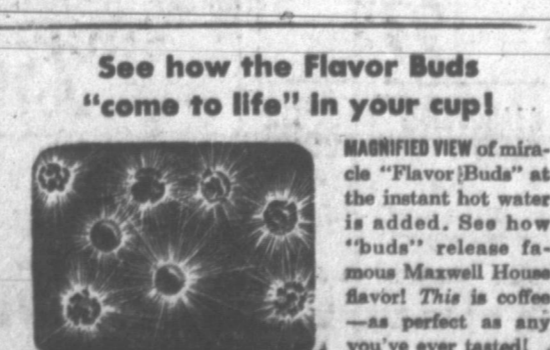



Accused Stand Little Chance As Red Hilde Goes On Rampage

BERLIN (AP)—Red Hilde is on the warpath in East Germany and the scapls are piling up. Almost weekly, some new group of broken men is haled before the state Supreme Court, told what the sin was, given virtually no chance of defense, and sent off to long prison terms, up to life, at hard labor.

The defendants are charged principally with plotting against the Communist state, working with and for "Western spies," or "sabotage" of the Soviet zone economic laws patterned after Marx and Stalin. Many are merely men who failed to realize one never says "No" in any manner after the Communists have spoken.

The Russian zone uses the trials to put on public displays. Red followers are given a day off to pack the courtroom.

The boss is a woman, 50-year-old Hilde Benjamin, who has long been known among Berliners as "Red Hilde."

Frau Benjamin holds the curious title of "vice president" of the court. The president, Hans Schumann, never seems to preside. Hilde, faithful to the Kremlin in all respects, is the boss. There are some estimates that Hilde Benjamin has personally sent upwards of a thousand men to slow death in labor camps under the guise of legal sentencing.

For two years, she has dished out sentences just as harsh as she cares to make them. Now she is embarked on a broader scheme, the complete reorganization of all legal thinking in East Germany. The plan calls for abolition of the traditional courts and replacing them with a new set of tribunals.

Next to party boss Walter Ulbricht, Frau Benjamin is probably the most feared person in the whole East German machinery. She never regards a defendant as a man who might eventually prove his innocence. From the moment he is placed on trial, the man is assailed, ridiculed and tongue-lashed.

Birds Fly For Carver

SCITUATE, R. I. — (AP) Allen J. King, 71, can carve 400 varieties of sporting birds, in miniature, out of wood, and the way he explains it, it's pretty simple.

"First I make a sketch of the bird on paper," he says. "Next I draw an outline of the bird on a piece of wood. Then I sit and look first at one and then at the other, and make up my mind how far I've got to go into the wood to fine the rest of the bird."

The birds, products of King's all over the United States. In his middle 50s, King was working for a providence taxidermist. He got to thinking what a nuisance stuffed birds sometimes can be. It occurred to him that miniature wooden birds might be better. So he set about looking for them in pieces of wood and sure enough, there they were.

Then he carved and painted their plumage and mounted them on bases of weathered wood which he finds in the nearby woodlands. He "finds" the birds in pattern-makers' pine.

"Of course," explains King, "I've tinkered at art all my life."

Such tinkering includes water colors, oils, block prints, etching and dry points. He also cuts bird silhouettes.

Wisely read in bird lore, he knows just what he's looking for when he goes hunting for birds "in the wood."

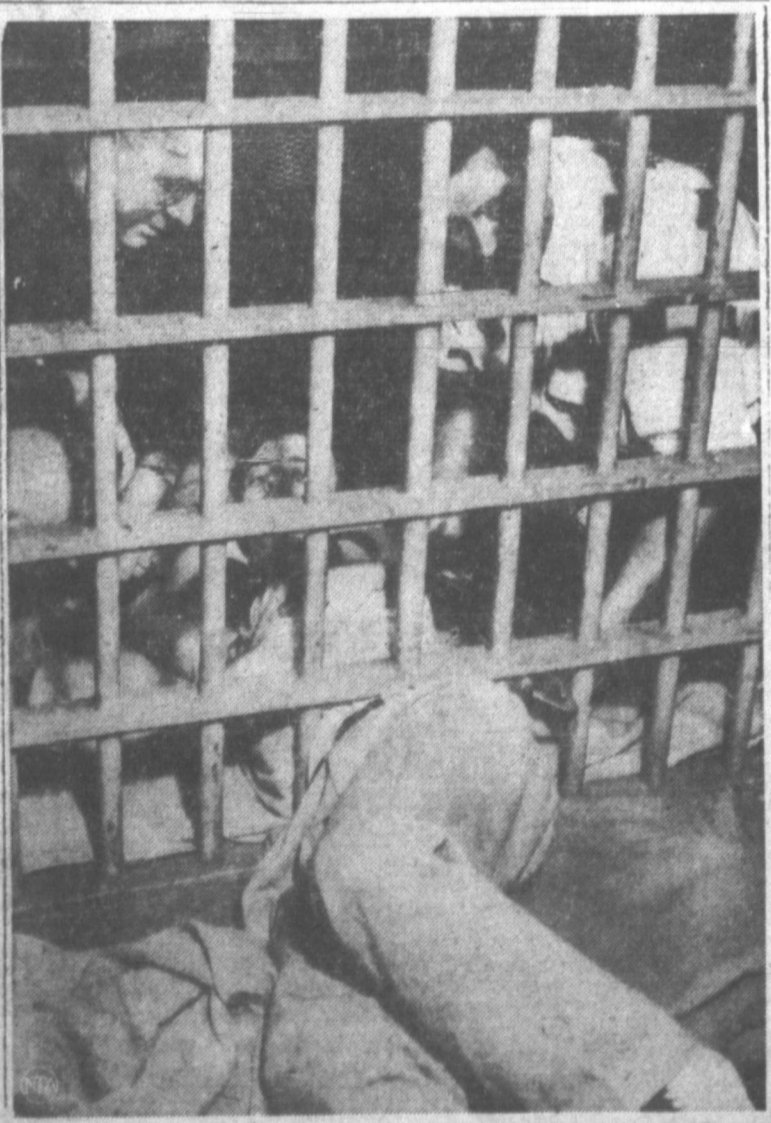
Fred is 13 and is to be in the seventh grade at junior high next year. He "never did" like school, he says, but he doesn't mind geography and history too much.

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Honors Go To Choreograph In Rita Hayworth's Dance

When Rita Hayworth does the Dance of the Seven Veils in her forthcoming picture, "Salome," there will be wolf calls audible from Portland, Maine, to Portland, Oregon.

The flaming Rita, of course, can take the bows, but there should be a few for the young woman who conceived the sensational dance and worked for weeks with "Affair in Trinidad."

Miss Hayworth to polish every movement.

She is a Valerie Bettis, a glamor girl herself, who was born in Texas and has won wide acclaim both as a choreographer and as a dancer in such Broadway hits as "Inside USA," "Great to Be Alive" and "Bless You All."

Valerie Bettis, who looks like a famous juvenile delinquent, talks like a juvenile delinquent, says Valerie, since the Hollywood Bankhead was hired by Columbia to stage Rita's dances and wound up playing a part in the picture when an alert casting director spotted her on the set.

Figuring out the "Dance of the Seven Veils" was no small chore, says Valerie, since the Hollywood version of "Salome" differs drastically from the familiar Oscar Wilde conception. Hollywood makes Salome a nice girl, who does her famous dance to save the life of John the Baptist instead of demanding his head on a platter.

Says Valerie: "Working out the Dance of the Seven Veils with no head and no platter, was, as you can see, a sharp break with tradition. But we did it."

In the dance Rita wears the seven veils, all right, and each is a different color. Here Valerie did some neat calculating, too, making the outer veil black, and progressing through the cool colors such as peacock blue and purple, through the flame tones to the final veil, which is, natch, flesh colored.

Valerie does not appear in "Salome," but the mark of her genius is plainly visible in the spectacular choreography. She gives full credit to Rita, however, saying:

"Rita is a natural dancer. Her arm and hand movements particularly are pure music. She has a rhythmic sense which is a joy to a dance director. And my original conception of the dance, of course, is adapted to her own personality."

How does Miss Bettis work out a new dance routine? She isn't quite sure, but says:

"Usually I just sit and brood, and listen to the music, and then all at once I see it."

"I work out some of the routine myself, and then work with the star, so that in the end the dance is a blend of what I thought of first and the star's interpretation of it."

Valerie had her first stage part in the class play at Houston's Sidney Lanier Junior High School. Later, at San Jacinto High, she did her first choreography, and then went to the University of Texas but quit before graduation to join the famous Hanya Holm group in New York.

She went on to do the choreography for a number of Broadway productions, and has had many Hollywood offers. But most of them she has turned down because — she is married to Bernardo Segall, brilliant Brazilian pianist and composer and she just loves New York.
