Perry spokeswoman Allison Castle and the Texas Department of Public Safety con-
firmed Friday group says it wants to "restore America" by peacefully dismantling parts of government. Texas officials won't say when the letter arrived. They're not releasing any other infor-

This week, dozens of governors received letters saying if they don't leave office
within three days they will be removed, according to federal documents obtained by The Associated Press.
