ment through Sept. 30 . The restriction is opposed by ment through hept. powers to curb greenhouse gases after global warming says the ban would cost thousands of construction jobs. EPA has already taken steps to regulate global warming pollution from vehicles and the largest factories and
industrial plants. It is expected to soon roll out rules that target refineries and power plants.
