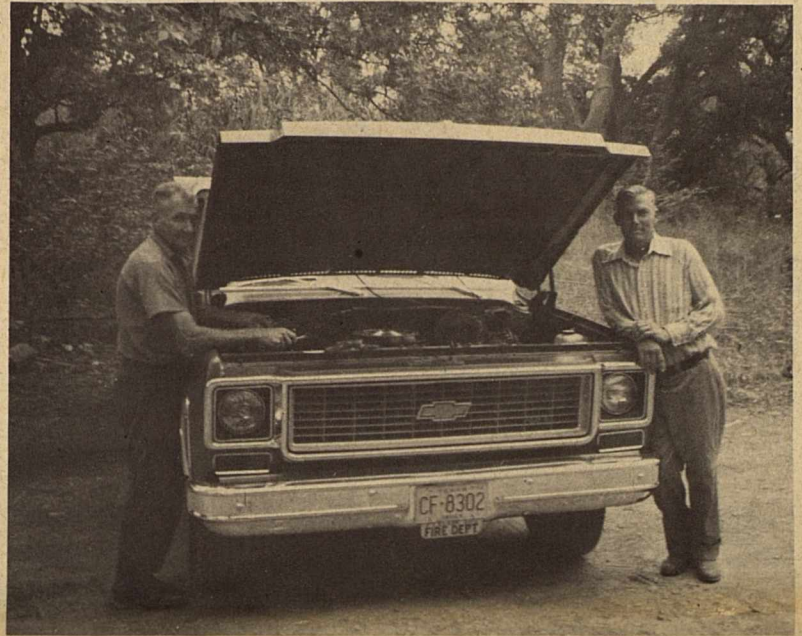

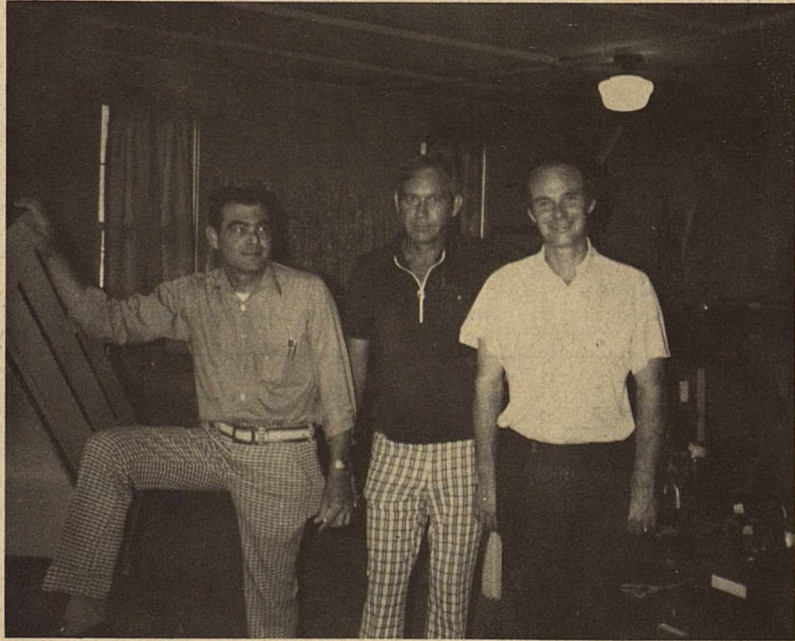

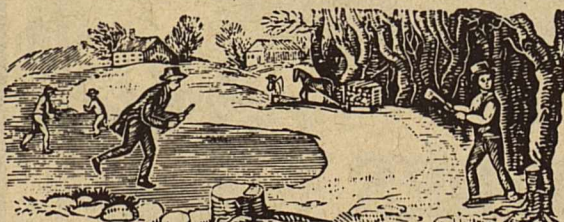
THE FIX-IT SHOP--Robert Dowling and Ray Huntley not only repair autos, also small appliances, air conditioning, refrigerators, and what have you.

Tonight in Tiger Land the Tigers plan to do just that as they meet their first District foe in the Big Dilly Football Team. This is Dilly's first year in our District and they always field a good football team and this year is no exception. Dilly is big and strong and the Tigers will have to be up mighty high to come out on the top. Of course we firmly believe the Tigers will be ready and bring home a Victory. 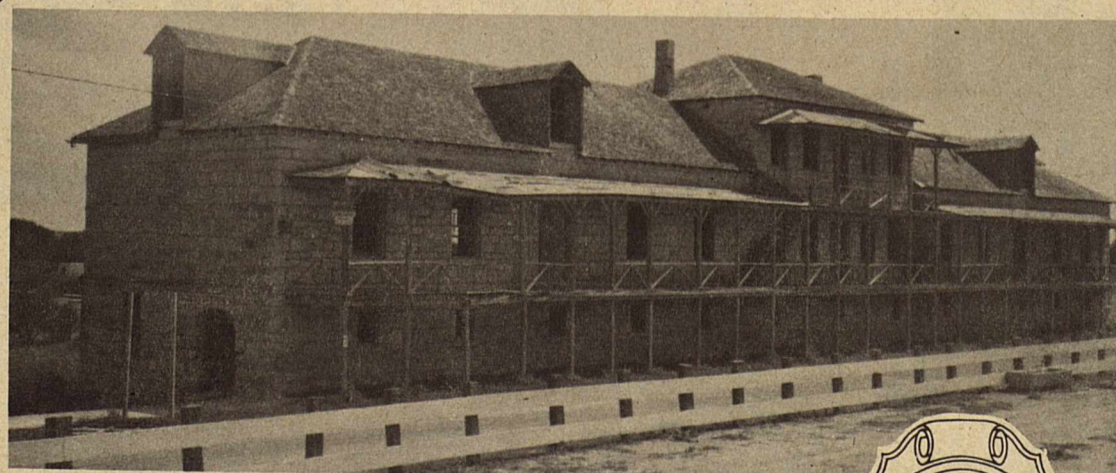

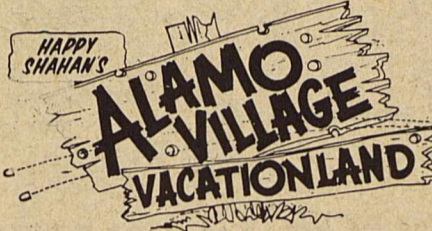

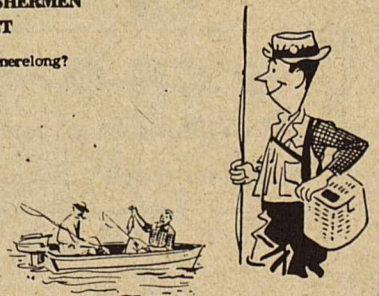
