signed. That position is now signed. That position is now
open for a new term as is the open for a new term as is the
Republican county chair. No Republican county chair. No one took the Republican posi-
tion after Brice Key turned in his resignation for the 20062008 term; that vacancy resulted in no Republican pri-

It is not the job of the local county clerk to run the primary elections. Primary elections are conducted solely by the political parties involved. So, if no county chair steps up to assume the roles, then no primary elections are held.
The county chair office duties include filing candidate papers, depositing candidates' filing fees, working closely with the county clerk to insure voting precincts are staffed and maintained with ballots and/or voting machines, organizing and paying election day workers, and then reconciling all paperwork with the Secretary of State's office. Much of the final paperwork can be done online, facilitating some of that

## Combine Cooking Time With Family Time

If you're caught between finding time to prepare meals and spending quality time with your children, try cooking with them. Here are suggestions for cooking with kids from "Kids in the Kitchen" in the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture's Tips for Using the Food Guide Pyramid for Young Children.
Children enjoy helping in the kitchen and often are more willing to eat foods they help prepare. Involve your child in planning and preparing some meals and snacks for the fammeal

When your child is helping you with food preparation, don't forget cleanliness. Wash hands using soap and warm running water before and after handling food or utensils to prepare food.
It is important that you give kitchen tasks appropriate for your child's age. Be patient as your child gains new skills at different ages.
Meal Preparation Activities for Young Children:
Children have to be shown and taught how to do these ac
tivities. Each child has his or her own pace for learning, so give it time and the skills will come. Expect a few spills. It's a small price to pay for helping your children become comfortable around food.
2-year-olds:

* Bring ingredients from one place to another
* Wipe table tops
* Tear lettuce or greens
* Break cauliflower
* Snap green beans
* Play with utensils

3 -year-olds: Can do what 2 -year-olds do, plus...
*. Wrap potatoes in foil for baking

* Knead and shape yeast dough
* Pour liquids
* Mix ingredients
* Shake liquids in covered container
* Spread soft spreads
* Place things in trash

4-year olds: Can do all that
2- and 3-years-olds do, plus...

* Move hands to form round shape
* Cut parsley or green onions with dull scissors
* Mash bananas using fork
* Set table

5-to 6-year-olds: Can do all that 2-, 3-, and 4-years-olds do, plus...

* Measure ingredients
* Cut with blunt knife
* Use an egg beater

## DEMOCRATIC PARTY

## Term of Office and Qualifications

To be eligible for the office of county chair, an individual must meet these requirements:

- Be 18 years of age or older
- Be a qualified voter who has voted in the latest Democratic primary (not counting runoffs) in the voting year
- Be a resident of the county from which he or she is seeking election
- Not be a candidate for or holder of an elective office of the federal, state, or county government
- (Optional but highly desirable) have Internet and e-mail capabilities and basic computer skills


## Filing for Office

The county chair is a publicly elected party official and is elected by precinct voters in the Democratic Primary Election (or in the runoff election, if no candidate gets a majority in the general primary). A qualified individual interested in running for county chair must do the following:

- Download a filing form, or obtain one from your county chair, the secretary of the County Party, or from the State Party
- Complete the application
- Sign the application before a notary public
- Have the filing form notarized
- Submit the application to the county chair in the period that begins in early December and ends at 6:00 PM on the first business day in January. The specific opening date is 30 days before the first business day in January of an election year.

The form may be submitted in either of two ways:

- Hand the completed, signied, and notarized application to the county chair; or - Mail the completed, signed, and notarized application to county chair (must be received by the filing deadline)


## REPUBLICAN PARTY

The qualifications to be a Republican Party County Chairman are:

1) be a qualified voter in that county [Election Code sec. 161.005], 2) not be a county, state, or federal public officeholder or candidate for such office, and 3) in a general election year, be affiliated with the Republican Party through voting in the GOP primary election or runoff or by oath of affiliation [Election Code sec. 162.001 162.012].

The Election Code provides two methods for becoming a County Chairman.

## Election for two-year term

Candidates for County Chair run for office in the primary election each even-numbered year. A one-page notarized application must be submitted to the County Chair (yourself if seeking re-election) within a one-month filing period. Individuals may also run as write-in candidates.

If two or more candidates file, the winner is determined by majority vote of those voting in the Republican primary election. If no one files, there is to be a line on the ballot where voters may write in the name of someone to serve as County Chairman. Write-in candidates must win a majority of votes just like candidates actually listed on the ballot.

## Appointment to fill vacancy

Any eligible person may be appointed to fill a County Chair vacancy at any time. Appointment is by majority vote of Precinct Chairs present at a properly called meeting with a quorum (in this case, fifty percent of filled positions) present.
