

QUARANTINED AGAINST

A mass meeting of the citizens of Spur was held Thursday night of last week at the Commercial Club offices for the purpose of discussing the advisability of quarantining the town and county against all visitors to Fort Worth during the Fat Stock Show, the report having come here that an epidemic of small pox is raging in that city.

While we were not present at the meeting we understand that after hearing several talks by citizens as well as the doctors, it was decided to ask County Health Officer Blackwell of Dickens to institute quarantine proceedings and as a result the quarantine was effected and put in force Friday, and all those who came in from Fort Worth were given the privilege of going through with a disinfectant process or be detained in a pest camp for ten days. Up to date all have acquiesced in the disinfectant procedure in preference to the disadvantages of a detention camp.

While possibly the reports of the existing conditions in Fort Worth may have been somewhat enlarged upon with respect to the actual conditions, yet the general public of this section will feel much safer, and Dr. Blackwell is to be commended for his prompt action and efficient manner of handlinly the situation, thus not only alleviating the fears of the general public but effectively overcoming the possibility of a single case developing in the country. 
