Field Day On Grasses To Be Held Sept. 30

A public field day will be held on September 30 at the Soil Conservation Service plant materials center at Knox City according to John W. Lee, District Soil Conservation Service technician.

New grasses, forbs, legumes and plants under evaluation will be available.

The center, which serves both Texas and Oklahoma.

Some 675 strains of 164 different plants are being grown at Knox City to try to find superior strains that will solve specific soil and water conservation problems. The more promising ones are then grown and evaluated under field conditions on farms of soil and water conservation district cooperators under a wide variety of conditions. months at the Rising Star Judge Tom Deens, Justice of the Peace in 1924 held court during the summer Band Stand, located in the vicinity of today's Elite Cafe.

The Band Stand, a small open air tabernacle sort of a building was equipped with rude board benches to be used by band members. Judge Deens moved a "small center table" and a cain bottom chair to the stand and was ready for court.

It was the custom to hold court on Saturday afternoons. About 1:30 p.m. sounds of "Oheyz" "oheyz-oheyz" issued from the direction of the band stand and a crowd started gathering. There was always a goodly number of spectators as well as witnesses.

Fourth Monday Trades Day was revived in Rising Star in April 1924.

This old old custom had been abandoned years before, because transients driving from town to town dragging a bunch of boney, half starved nags and a gang of dogs just as starved as the horses, into town, camping near the business section. They were a dirty unkept, shiftless people. There was begging, pilfering and other objectional practices. The City Council decided to banish such people from the city limits. As a result Trades Day was completely discontinued.

After a meeting of the city council and citizens a vote was cast to bring the day back to Rising Star on a new basis. The Trades Day was to be held once a month.

Camp grounds were secured on vacant lots west of the old gin tract on the Pioneer road. A trade ground was set up on the Higginbotham lot south of the depot.

And Trades Day again became a part of the life of Rising Star.

Humble Oil and Refining Company built a gasoline plant in the Blake field during the heyday of oil booms in this area.

In October 1934 more than one hundred local men were given employment by Humble Company when they spent some \$15,000 on repair at the plant.

An entire renovation, repair and painting program was carried out, including all residences at the plant, tanks, and equipment.

One of the most tragic accidents ever to occur in this area involved a 17,000 pound Greyhound bus carrying seven passengers. The accident occurred three miles west of Cisco on Highway One.

Dropping of the tie rod on the steering apparatus caused the bus to plunge off the overpass killing three of the passengers instantly and one person died shortly after being taken to the hospital. The bus driver suffered only minor injuries.

On investigation Greyhound officials gave the statement that because of the equipment failure the driver had no control of the bus and it crashed through the concrete barriers along the highway and landed forty feet below the overpass.
