10,081 License Plates Sold For Year 1953

EASTLAND - A total of 10,081 license plates for cars, trucks, trailers and tractors have been issued by the office of Tax Collector-Assessor Stanley Webb at Eastland since February.

Most of the new '53 tags were delivered in February and March, although a few individuals paid the small penalty and purchased license plates during the month of April.

Eastland will be richer by many thousands of dollars as the county gets a "big cut" from the sale of license plates.

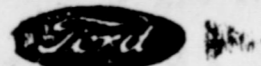
