Swift & Company Shelling Plant Will Open Soon

The Swift and Company peanut shelling plant in Carbon, which has been temporarily closed down for the past several months, has been re-opened and is ready to resume operation as soon as they start receiving peanuts from South Texas. They hope to start shelling in the next few days.

This is one of Carbon's largest industries and employs a large crew of workers. L. P. Barnett and J. T. Wilson, who have been working in the Swift plant at Stephenville the past few months, have been transferred back to Carbon to reopen the plant and Mr. Barnett states they will be in the market for local peanuts, and from all indications one of the largest crops to be harvested in the past several years is in the making.

Eastland To Hold Horned Toad Derby Saturday

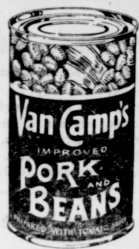

Frozen Lemon Pie Is Toothsome Dish

FROZEN lemon pie is a toothsome dinner dessert for the family that's been working hard all day, says the Country Cooking editor of Capper's Farmer.

Graham cracker crumbs are crust and topping for the chilled yellow filling, she writes in the nationally-circulated farm magazine. Pie-shaped pieces are made by cutting diagonally across the refrigerator tray in which pie is frozen.

The dessert which will be an ever-popular family favorite, serves 8, the Capper's Farmer expert advises.



FROZEN LEMON PIE
1 egg, separated 1 c. evaporated milk, whipped
1/2 c. lemon juice 1/2 c. graham cracker crumbs
1/2 c. sugar 1/2 c. cake crumbs

Beat egg yolks; add lemon juice and piece of rind sliced from lemon and all but 2 tablespoons of the sugar. Cook over low heat 15 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove rind and cool. Beat egg whites until stiff; add remaining sugar and fold into cooked mixture. Add whipped evaporated milk. Line refrigerator tray with waxed paper. Sprinkle with 1/4 cup of the crumbs. Pour in lemon mixture; sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Freeze with temperature set at coldest. Serves 8.

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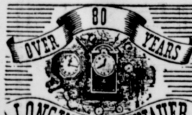

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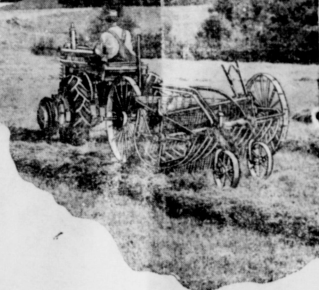

He Loved Teaching

Lesson for August 13, 1959

WHAT WOULD YOU do if you had a million dollars? Several thousand school teachers were asked that question a few years ago. Seventy-five per cent of them gave the same answer: "I'd resign." They weren't real teachers, they were only hired help. The other twenty-five per cent were the real teachers. A great university teacher, Palmer of Harvard, wrote that he had the perfect job. Believe it or not, he said, "Harvard actually pays me for doing what—if I could afford it. I would gladly pay Harvard to let me do."

No Finished Product THE REAL thing about teaching is that you are dealing with people, young people, growing people. In every other line of business, whatever you turn out begins to depreciate almost as soon as it leaves the factory. It doesn't take long for butter to get rancid, or bread to stale. A can of orange juice is a feeble imitation of a fresh one. A car that has changed hands once, even if it has run less than 1,000 miles, is already a "used" car on its way to the junk-pile.

But the products of "teacher's classrooms are by means "finished" products when they leave it, even if it is a finishing school. If the teacher's work has been done well, the product will go on improving for years, instead of running down.

Three Aims PROFESSOR EZRA, of Babylon and Jerusalem, was one of history's most famous teachers. We note (Ezra 7:10) the same three aims in Ezra's life that you would expect to find in all good teachers. First of all, he "prepared his heart" to do what he did. The "heart" is the Bible expression for character, for life as a whole. No one can be a truly good teacher who has a bad character.

Now Ezra prepared his heart to do three things. The first was to "seek the law of the Lord." What a teacher teaches may be as important as who his pupils are; and Ezra's "subject" was the law which God had given his people—part of what we now call the Old Testament.

Second, Ezra prepared his heart to do the law. The old heart to do the law. The old who cannot, teaches," is true of poor teachers, not of the good ones. Particularly not true of Bible teachers. The aim of Bible teaching, from Moses' time till now, is always practical. "Truth is in order to goodness," as the Presbyterians say.

And third, Ezra set out to "teach in Israel." Your research scholar may or may not make a good teacher. The good teacher is not hired by teaching as some researchers are. He loves it.

Take Yourself, for Example **NOW LET US** see how this comes in your own home Sunday school. If yours is like most Sunday schools, the main trouble with it is that they don't find enough good teachers, enough people who really want to know about God's word themselves, who live and love to help others know it.

The Rev. H. M. Lewis of Texas has said in his essay, The Dividends of Teaching: "When you begin to teach you will realize that at last you have found a purpose for your religion... Teaching gives a motive, the highest motive, for all acts of religion and for all pursuit of knowledge—'For their sakes.' Every Christian has the missionary obligation and is by virtue of his profession of faith, a missionary—'Go, teach all nations.' Make your particular nation young America and your special opportunity systematic work in the Church school." 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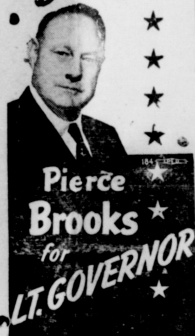

Raise Some Vegetables You Can't Buy



The only way you can be sure of having certain delicious vegetables for your table is to raise them in your own garden.

Take Swiss chard, for example. These appetizing greens have been widely grown in Victory Gardens these war years. The reason you don't see them in the markets is because the delicate foliage wilts quickly after picking. To enjoy Swiss chard at its best, you should use it shortly after cutting. The same planting will furnish many a "mess of greens" over a long period if only the outside stalks are cut each time, allowing the center leaves to go on growing. (See illustration).

Savoy is a type of cabbage not at all improved by being hauled from place to place . . . the crinkly brittle leaves bruise so easily. By growing a few heads in the garden, you can have this tender, delicately flavored, nearly odorless variety at its finest. It takes no more exertion and care than raising plain cabbage. Chieftain is the variety which has become a universal favorite.

Friends who come to dinner will exclaim over edible pod peas from your garden vines. This is a type of pea which is cooled and eaten like snap beans, pod and all, when the young peas have barely begun to form. The picking for this mouth-watering dish

may have originated in France or Holland. Folks of Dutch ancestry are the ones most familiar with edible pod peas in our own land. Once grown in anyone's garden, they are likely to be on the repeater list year after year.

Do you know that odd shaped vegetable, kohlrabi? Plant a row of it and give the family something out of the ordinary. Although related to cabbage, it is milder and more delicate in flavor. It looks like a turnip growing above ground. Kohlrabi matures quite rapidly and should be eaten when about two inches in diameter.

Anybody can have common cucumber pickles. You can add that extra touch to your list of appetizers by raising West India gherkins. The prickly little oval fruits, picked when fairly small, make unusually good sweet pickles . . . nearly impossible to get these days for love or money.
