




Me: "Yes, Kirk, I will."



# Beck's back with more cryptic trip-hop

At first listen, the new release by Beck may sound like just a lot of cluttered, trippy noises piled on top of a hip-hop beat. Closer inspection, however, will reveal a method to the madness Beck emworth checking out.






