DISCHARGED SOLDIER

Camp Travis, March 3-A bonus of sixty dollars will be paid every person, who served in the military or naval forces of the United States during the present war and who has resigned or been discharged under honorable conditions since April 6, 1917. This bonus also applies in the case of reservists who have been placed on inactive duty, or who, at any time thereafter, but not later than the termination of the current enlistment or term of service, in the case of enlisted personnel and female nurses, or within one year after the termination of the present war in the case of officers, may resign or be discharged under honorable conditions. .
