County Retail Sales, Deposits Up Says New WTCC Committee Report

The West Texas area showed a population increase of 6% from 1960 to 1970, according to a study released by the West Texas Chamber of Commerce this week. Figures are based upon preliminary census figures and will change slightly when final figures are released.

Population gains were substantial in the area with a gain of 58% and bank deposits were up 16% according to F. V. Wallace of Amarillo, president of the regional organization.

The report compares population growth or loss with the economic trends for each of the 132 counties in the West Texas area. Chamber officials explained that a large percentage of the increase in retail sales and bank deposits can be attributed to inflation. After the inflation factor is removed there are still substantial increases of 13% in retail sales and 44% increase in bank deposits.

The report shows that Eastland lost 10% in population between 1960 and 1970. During the same period bank deposits in the county increased 100% and retail sales increased 13%.

The eastern one-third of West Texas, east of the 100th meridian, showed a larger growth than other areas in both population and other economic factors.

FB Leaders Attend Meeting On Membership At Brownwood

Eight leaders of the Eastland County Farm Bureau participated in a special statewide Farm Bureau membership report activity Oct. 26. They were Mr. and Mrs. Jack Cozart, Mr. and Mrs. Sam Kimmell, Ray Norris, Ann Justice, Cheryl Stephens, and Buddy Aaron.

The District seven meeting they attended in Brownwood was one of 13 such meetings held that same evening across the state.

Sam Kimmell, membership chairman, turned in a report showing 886 member families signed up as of that date. The end of the Farm Bureau fiscal year is Oct. 31. Eastland County has a goal of 900 members for this year. Last year's membership was 820.

A telephoned report of membership results in the district was made that evening to Texas Farm Bureau President Sidney Dean in Waco, when reports from all districts had been compiled. The TFB leader called each district meeting with statewide results.

As of Oct. 26, the Texas Farm Bureau membership stood at 119,666. The state's largest farm organization ended its fiscal year Oct. 31 with a total membership of 116,622 families, making it the third largest state Farm Bureau in the nation.

B. J. Gist of Abilene, District seven director, urged all

counties in this district to make a special effort to help bring the TFB membership to 125,000 for the year. The national Farm Bureau meeting will be in Houston in December, and the Texas Farm Bureau hopes to be recognized there for having a gain in every one of its 293 organized county Farm Bureaus.

In a special message read to the assembled leaders, Dean reminded them that the strength of Farm Bureau is within its membership.

"Changes that are taking place in our economic, social and political climate and the impact of these changes on agriculture make it imperative that Farm Bureau leadership accept the challenge to build the kind of organization that agricultural producers must have to cope with these changes," Dean said in his message to the county leaders.

Also on the program at the district meeting was a report on the progress being made by the State Farm Bureau Program Expansion Committee which was appointed last month. Doyle Conner of Runnels County who is the representative from this district on this committee, presented the report.

"Front burner" issues in which Farm Bureau is active presently were discussed by the TFB field representative, J. D. Jordan of Mason, Texas, and District director.

If you haven't fertilized your lawn this fall you should do so as soon as possible. An application of fertilizer should be made 30 days before the average first frost date. Recommended fertilizers for the application are 16-20-0 or 10-20-10. The 16-20-0 should be applied at the rate of about 12 pounds per 1000 square feet, and the 10-20-10 should be applied at the rate of 20 pounds per 1000 square feet.

You are going to see a lot of improvements made in the Kokomo community in the future. Those people have pride in their community and it's showing up in the new brick church and the remodeling of the old school building. They organized a community club under the oak trees, but plan to be meeting in the community center which was the old school building. Billy Walker is their president. Under his leadership they have entered the Texas Community Improvement Program.

As I drove through the community a couple of weeks ago I saw four men putting a new roof on the community center. I stopped and talked with J. C. Clearman, Floyd Woods, Alwin Laster, and Orval Treadway. They told me of the plans to remodel the building. Most of the material and all the labor is being donated. They said other people in the community would be working on the center after the peanut harvest is completed.

The weather was very disagreeable for the peanut tour on Oct. 8 as well as the Experiment Station field day Oct. 15.

About 25 men met at Carbon on Oct. 8 and we visited these peanut demonstrations. The temperature was in the low 40's and the wind was blowing about 30 miles per hour. The

Citizens Fall Fair At Eastland

Plans for a Senior Citizens Fall Fair and Bazaar were made by Home Demonstration Council in a meeting on Oct. 7, in the Eastland Farm Bureau Building. The bazaar will be in Eastland, Nov. 21.

Mrs. Glenn Jordan presided over the meeting and Mrs. Herman Schaefer led the opening exercise. Reports were given on the trip to the State Convention by Misses. Guy Sherrill, Janet Thomas, Mary Dietz and Cora Plumlee.

Peanut production is probably the largest economic industry in Eastland County. Every person in this county is affected directly or indirectly by this industry. Much of the progress made in peanut farming can be credited to the experiment station in Stephenville. Scientists there developed the Starr variety which is the major peanut variety grown in the Southwest. It was named in honor of the late W. B. Starr of Cisco.

The station was once known as the West Cross Timbers Experiment Station, but is now known as the Texas A&M-Tarleton Experiment Station.

Peanut harvest is getting under way in Eastland County. If the weather will permit peanut combines will be busy during the next few weeks.

A lack of proper equipment adjustment and improper equipment use are the source of large losses to peanut producers in the Southwest each year. These losses are due to excessive split kernels, loose shelled kernels and foreign material. The combined losses due to these deductions amounted to over \$130,000.09 for Eastland County producers alone.

There are a number of causes for these losses. Some of the main ones are excessively fast combine field speed, excessive combine cylinder speed, improper combine adjustments, rough handling and walking on loose or bagged peanuts, alternate rain and partial curing in the field, and high air temperature in the field while peanuts are curing. Not much can be done about the last two items but much can be done about the others.

Information supplied by some 25,000 Texas farmers and ranchers will become the basis for the field official crop production estimates for each county and the State.

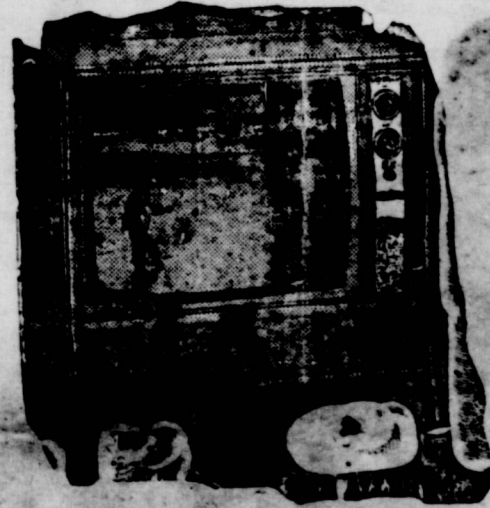

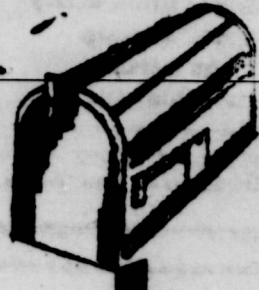

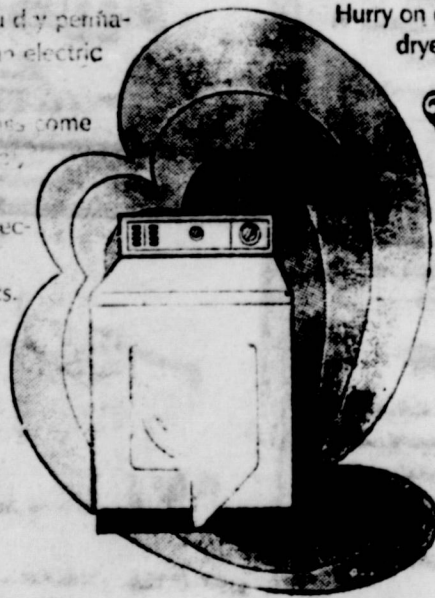
