YANKS CAPTURE WORLD SERIES



After holding back the thirtyacre lake of water, ranging to a denth of twenty-five or thirty feet, for about twenty-four hours, down Los Arroyo and into the Colorado River a short distance

The rains falling here since Saturday morning filled the lake brim full, and the water was almost ready to trickle over the spillway when the dam broke, It was the first rain of any consequence since the dam was completed, and many of the club members visited the lake throughout the day Monday and were highly elated over the beautiful lake of water created for what promised to be an ideal pleasure

The Country Club dam was constructed last spring, being completed during early summer, at a cost of about \$6,300. It was approximately 550 feet long, and thirty feet high at the highest point. The damage caused by the washout is probably \$1,000 or \$1,500, and expressions from different members of the club indicate that no time will be lost in


