



# KLAN ISSUE RULED OUT OF **WALTON TRIAL**

OKLAHOMA CITY, Nov. 12.-The first attempt to inject the Ku Klux Klan issue into the impeachment trial of Governor Jack C. Walton failed today when the Senate court refused to permit Homer Martin to answer a question that bore directly on the governor's opposition to the Klan.

Martin, who guarded the executive's residence, told the court that the governor's life had been threatened. "Was not that about the time that Walton, as mayor, issued a proclamation directed against the Klan?" counsel for the defense asked. The prosecution objected to the question, and the oral vote.


