Family Trouble Leads Shooting of Marie Man

U. G. Thomas is in the Halley & Love Sanitarium suffering with gun-shot wounds, and charges of assault with intent to murder have been filed against Joe Haygood as the result of a shooting on Thomas' farm near Marie in the Northwestern part of Runnels county early Saturday morning.

Sheriff McWilliams was called to Marie, 18 miles from Ballinger, following the shooting, and found Haygood at the home of a neighbor, where he was waiting for the officer to come after him. Haygood was brought to Ballinger, and an examination was being held Saturday afternoon with a view to fixing bond for the man. Quite a number of neighbors and friends accompanied Haygood to Ballinger, or arrived here a short time after he was brought to town, and were waiting to sign any bond which might be fixed

At two o'clock Saturday afternoon a report from the sanitarium said that Thomas was resting well and the wounds were not considered necessary fatal, and probably would not prove to be very serious. An operation had been performed and the shot removed. Thomas was shot with No. 4 shot, two charges from a double barreled shot-gun being fired at a distance of fifty or Exty feet. The bones in both hands were said to be broken. One shot penetrated the forehead above the eye, one entered the side, several struck him in the lower limbs and groins.

Statements made by witnesses, and by the defendant himself, had not been made public by the officers Saturday afternoon, the investigation having not been completed when The Ledger went to press, but neighbors stated that the shooting was the result of family trouble between Thomas and Haywood which had been existing for more than a year. According to an account of the shooting as related to The Ledger by parties more or less familiar with the circumstances, Haywood want to the Thomas home about midnight Friday night and secreted himself near the house, expecting Thomas to come out some time later. Thomas did not come out of the house until about 7:00 o'clock Saturday morning, or a short time after daylight. He started towards the lot and when within a short distance of where Haygood was waiting Haygood opened fire with a double-barreled shot-gun. Haygood got between Thomas and the house, and after being shot Thomas ran about three-quarters of a mile to a meighbor's house and called for a gun. Failing to get a gun he continued to another neighbor's house. In the meantime Haygood, who made chase after Thomas, was stopped by a neighbor.

Haygood has been living in the Marie country for about three years. Thomas has been a citizen of that part of the county for twenty-five years, or more. The tragedy brought quite a crowd of the Marie-Norton citizens to Ballinger Saturday afternoon.

The first report of the shooting reached Ballinger about eight o' clock Saturday morning in a call to Sheriff McWilliams. Mr. Mc-Williams left immediately for Marie after conferring with the county attorney. It was at first reported that Thomas was dead, but a later report stated that he was seriously wounded, and the extent of his injuries had not been determined.

The shooting is said to have taken place near the home of Thomas, about daylight Saturday morning, Haygood using a shotgun. The tragedy is the outgrowth of trouble which has been brewing for more than a year and is the result of alleged famliy dif-



SIMPLE FOR PRES

WASHINGTON, March 4. -Calvin Coolidge came today to he beginning of a four-year term as president of the United States y direct and overwhelming mandate of the people. With him came Charles Dawes to fill the office of vice-president, which was left vacant nineteen months ago when solemnly and sadly Mr. Coolidge first took the presidential oath in the family homestead n Vermont upon the death of President Warren G. Harding.

The inauguration ceremony, exemplifying tastes of both men and he frugal policy they have oledged themselves to pursue in he conduct of the nation's affairs was arranged at the president's direction on the simplest scale in century, and began about 11:00 'clock a. m. with the 68th concress entering its last hour and continuing almost four hours.

The inaugural program excluded all extravagant pomp and ostly display, but omitted none of the quiet dignity manifesting the ideals of this mighty republic and the responsibilities of the world's most powerful office.

A few more than 10,000 persons vere allotted places in the traditional parade to make the historic oilgrimage along Pennsylvania Avenue. But among the throng were included many ranking oflicials and many states' high dignitaries in civil and military life.





Haygood made a lengthy statement relating to the trouble between himself and his wife in which he charged Thomas with paying attentions to Mrs. Haygoed for more than a year, and detailed incidents leading up to the tragedy.






