all details for the holding of the annual poultry, exhibit at Ballinger have been worked out, and that the big show will be held on January 22 and 23, Friday and Saturday.



PRACTICAL BAKING LESSONS



When properly made, there is nothing more appetizing for breakfast or tea than muffins, or gems, as they are sometimes called. With honey, preserves or marmalade, they readily make the chief feature of the meal, (and there are so many ways to vary them, that one can have a different kind about as often as she likes. Below I give a few choice and successful recipes.

nevada Brigge

A great many housewives have had trouble in making rich, light, moist muffins without their falling, and to overcome this, they have resorted to making the batter so stiff that when baked, the muffins are very dry. A muffin can be made almost as light and just as palatable as a pop-over, but to make a light, moist mussim which is not soggy in the center, a double-raise baking powder such as K C must be used. Some Helpful Suggestions

Mussins would be served on many more prepared so hurriedly that there is not time Like biscuits, the softer the dough goes enough to stir up muffins and bake them. batter may be stirred up the night before and if set in a cool place, it will remain in a partially leavened condition all night, and the raising will be completed when put in the oven in the morning. No difference will be noticed between muffins mixed the night before and those mixed immediately

The old fashioned way was to bake muffins. This recipe makes 12 large muffins. muffins in a hot oven, but this makes a Raisins or currants may be added if desired. thick heavy crust and a soggy center, which is unpalatable and hard to digest. The proper and healthful way to bake muffins is to start the oven at a low temperature, just as for baking cakes. When the muffins come up to the top of the pan, the heat should be raised, and they should be baked until a crisp crust is formed. This crust will be thin, and the centers will be found light and fluffy, but thoroughly baked.

Always sift the flour and baking powder together at least three times, no matter what kind of pastry is to be made. This will insure its rising evenly and the flour Sift together, three times, the meal, flour, is lightened by having air sifted into it.

Either water or milk may be used for first mixture alternately with the milk muffins. Milk will make the richer muffin little slowly to start, then increase heat to and brown better, but water will answer the purpose very nicely when milk is not

A most excellent "spread" for muffins, hot biscuits and hot cakes is made by creaming together about equal parts of butter and honey either strained or in the 4 or 5 slices of bacon fried crisp and broken to about the consistency of hard sauce and comb. If the butter is solid it will work up

Kansas City.-North or Lamar, Colo., just across the Kansas line on We, the undersigned, have the Santa Fe railway, is a series of irrigation lakes that have been made by building earthen dams across a creek valley. These lakes are fed by a canal forty miles long, leading from waters of the Arkansas, which Kansas National Bank of Commerce lost to Colorado several years ago.

Up there on the Colorado plains, two-thirds of a mile above sea level, is more than one hundred miles of shore line. Smooth, soft green prairie up in bold headlands, the world of flowers and grass meets and melts into the world of waters. Under the bright sunlight, seen through that crystal air, shimmering and shining, these lakes almost compel the belief that they are a mirage.

Kit Carson, could he again ride across these old familiar plains, would be tempted into trying to ride straight through what he would think must be only an appearance of water. For he and his friends never saw any really wet lake here. On a hot, still day they have seen myriads of lakes. But no real water covered these square miles in their day.

These lakes literally swarm with fish. At times they lie upon the surface so thickly that, as their fins move the whole surface is agitatetd as if a breeze was blowing over it. They are so plentiful that when the water is turned into the irrigation ditches the fish that have spawned and multiplied float down in schools and are carried out upon the fields of alfalfa and other | crops, and the farmers gather them up in wagon loads and salt down enough in a week to last them through

There are five of those lakes. They were finished in 1898, and the fish have been spawning and increasing in numbers ever since.
