PEACE IN MEXICO MAY NOT RESULT FROM MEDITATION

Washington Has Little Hopes of Mediation's Plans—Stated that Huerta Willing to Salute if Troops Evacuate Vera Cruz.

(United Press.)
WASHINGTON, May 1.—Permanent peace in Mexico is not expected here as a result from mediation. It is indicated today that an introduction of a joint resolution, making \$100,000,000.00 army appropriation bill immediately available, instead of June 1st. It is stated that this is consistent with precautions which are being

taken for any eventuality should mediation fail.

In a note received today, Huerta stated that he would be willing to salute the flag unconditionally if Vera Cruz is evacuated. Dictator Huerta has been told by the government that things have gone too far and that he must eliminate himself immediately.

1,500 AMERICANS IN MEXICO CITY

(United States.)
WASHINGTON, May 1.—Fifteen hundred Americans remain in Mexico City instead of eight hundred as reported last night. According to a dispatch of Consul Canada, the Americans are awaiting transportation to seaports. Several Americans who have been reported missing are safe in Mexico City.

HERSE TO FOLLOW RICH MINE OWNER

(United States.)
NEW YORK, May 1.—So violent have demonstrations against John D. Rockefeller Jr., become as result of the Colorado mine strike that guards were established about millionaire's home today. Sympathizers of the strikers plan to follow Rockefeller in public with a hearse everywhere he goes.
Upton Sinclair is on a hungry strike in jail.

CORNER STONE LAID

(United Press.)
Abilene, Tex., May 1.—The corner stone of the \$150,000 Taylor County court house was laid here today with the usual ceremonies. Distinguished Masons laid the stone which is of Georgia marble.

PACIFIC MAIL LINER FOUNDERED

(United States.)

SAN FRANCISCO, May 1.—A wireless message received here today stated that Pacific Mail Liner Siberian was ashore off Formosa. The message gave no details. The Siberian carried a crew of 282 men and eighty first-class passengers, including Mrs. Francis Burton Harrison, wife of the new governor of the Philippines. The steamer Minnesota, of Great Northwestern line gone to the Siberian's assistance.

The Siberian was an 18,000 ton displacement vessel with three complete decks, promenade deck, equipped fully with water tight bulkheads and declared unsinkable.

News of Ship Trouble Received at Washington.

(United States.)
WASHINGTON, May 1.—The state department was advised today by the Formosa government that the Siberian sent wireless for aid repeatedly but ceased finally this morning. A rescue vessel has been sent from Karenko, but it will take six hours to reach the position given by Siberian. The message ended, "Fear Siberia foundered."

Siberia Beached on Island.

(United Press.)
TOKIO, May 1.—Unconfirmed report reached here that Captain Zeeder of the Siberian wireless that his ship had been beached on an island a short distance from main land. No mention of danger to passengers were made in the wireless report.

CALVES BRING RECORD PRICE

FORT WORTH, Tex., May 1.—The highest price ever paid for calves on the local market since its establishment was recorded yesterday when T. B. Saunders & Company of Bridgeport sold 83 vealers to a commission company in this city for the handsome sum of \$9.50 per cwt. straight thru. The calves averaged 145 pounds each and was the smoothest lot ever sold here.

HIGH SCHOOL BOYS MEET.

(United Press.)
Austin, May 1.—The fourth annual meeting of the High School boys of Texas was opened here today with an unusually large crowd present. The meeting will be continued through tomorrow. Tonight the final contests in declamation will take place. Tomorrow morning the annual convention of the Interscholastic League will be held. The final debate will be held tomorrow night.

HUERTA MAKING EFFORT TO UNITE TWO FACTIONS

VERA CRUZ, May 7.—In a desperate effort to unite all factions, Huerta has released all political prisoners, according to today's advices received here from Mexico City. Huerta addressed a large body of prisoners after they had been released, declaring, "We are now brothers facing the common enemy the American evadors." Huerta also seized saloons in order to furnish soldiers a liberal supply of liquor and keep them loyal. It is believed that Huerta has made arrangements to make a quick flight in case of an out break. This news was received here today from Mexico City.

ON TO TAMPICO SAYS REBELS

El Paso, May 1.—"On to Tampico" is the Rebel slogan. Villa and his leading general met Jimmirose today and they are planning to take the sea port. Monterey will be made basis of supplies. Saltillo will be surrounded to prevent the Federal garrison from going to the relief of Federals at Tampico.

NORRIS CASE ON TRIAL.

J. Frank Norris, charged with burning the Baptist parsonage at Fort Worth, which he was occupying at the time fire destroyed the building and came near burning his family, is on trial at Fort Worth. The state is introducing testimony. The case has attracted considerable attention, and has caused much trouble in Fort Worth, where two factions has grown out of the burning of the parsonage and the church building.

MINERS MAY REFUSE TO DISARM

(United Press.)
TRINIDAD, Colo. May 1.—The strikers are seriously considering a refusal to disarm because of the demand of Major Holbrook, commanding the federal cavalrymen—that miners surrender their weapons while private mine guards retain theirs as long as they stay on mine property. There exists a friendly feeling between the regulars and the strikers, and constraining bitterness against militiamen.

Of course until I became satisfied of this I was very much disturbed. Telegram from him states that he is alright and feeling no danger whatever. He, however, took the precaution to send his wife and daughter out. Two of his daughters were on the Esperanza and landed in Galveston yesterday. His wife and young daughter were in Vera Cruz Monday, but are intending coming to Texas as early as possible."

They are billed to open a meeting at Greenville on May 30th, and will have two weeks in which to remain at Ballinger, if they accept the invitation.

These men are among the most successful evangelists in the Southwest. This is their second week in the Brownwood meeting and for the first week 43 professions, according to the Brownwood Bulletin. The Brownwood Bulletin in speaking of the meeting in a recent issue of the paper says:

The services of yesterday in the Austin Avenue Presbyterian revival were very successful. Four services were held, the street service at 9:30 a. m., the regular morning service at 10 a. m., at the First Presbyterian church, the children's service at 3:30 p. m. at the Austin Avenue church and the regular evening service at the church at 8 o'clock. In bringing these men to Ballinger it is the hope of the Eighth Street church to have the help of all other churches here, and that the meeting be made a union revival just as much as possible. It is the desire of the evangelist that the meeting be made a union meeting, and it is their policy to carry out such plans as will make the meeting a benefit to all the churches where they hold forth, and as is always the case, the church that puts the most interest in the meeting profits the greatest.

If he evangelist come, they will be here and start the meeting Sunday, May 10th.



Ryan Must Have Fair Trial.

WASHINGTON, May 1.—The administration is greatly concerned over the report of the threatened execution of Dr. Ryan, and through the Brazilian Ambassador at Mexico City the United States has demanded Huerta give Ryan a fair trial. The mediators are also anxious about the Ryan incident, and say that summary execution of the American would lead to reprisals by the United States.

Bryan Still Hopeful.

WASHINGTON, May 1.—Bryan said today that he was still hopeful that settlement of entire Mexican problem would soon be made satisfactory. He has roused comment upon the attitude of the Constitutionalists or indicate whether he believed their refusal to cease fighting menaced peace prospects. Circumstantial reports indicate that the administration has urged Villa to strike hard and without delay, and to take Saltillo and Tampico before mediators get far with their negotiations. The rebels could then demand recognition of belligerency, which if granted would raise embargo on arms and permit the dash to Mexico City.
