THE HIGH SCHOOL BOY'S BULLET HITS ITS MARK

LONDON, Aug. 24.—(By Mail to New York,)—The bullet which Gabriel Prinzip fired into the brain of the Archduke of Austria-Hungary on Sunday morning, June 28, shattered the peace of Europe. For many years Europe has been resting over a storehouse of dynamite. Many things threatened to set off the gigantic charge but kings and rulers and statesmen warded off the blow. It was only the vast dardaring and wise statesmanship of Sir Edward Grey, of England, that prevented the sparks of the Balkan War from flying into the Eurobean magazine. 


