INSTITUTE TO BEGIN TOMORROW

The Runnels County Teacher's Institute will convene Friday morning for a six-day session in Ballinger. The meetings will be conducted in the rooms of the Ballinger High School.

The address of welcome will be delivered Friday morning by Mayor J. W. Powell, at 9 o'clock in the morning. Following Mr. Powell's welcome to the scores of teachers, E. L. Hagan, former superintendent of the public schools of Runnels county, will make a short talk on "The Rural School of Tomorrow."

Just before noon, Jo Wilmeth of this city will make a speech on "The School as an Economic Factor."

The institute will continue through December 23rd, dismissing in time to allow the teachers attending to visit their homes for the Christmas holidays.

County Superintendent W. W. Wooten has issued an invitation to the citizens of Ballinger and vicinity to attend the meetings of the institute.

RUSSIANS RETREATING IN GALICIA

BERLIN, Dec. 17.—The Russians in Galicia are retreating, according to Austrian messages received in Berlin today. The Czar's forces have been routed by the Austrians who have won distinct victories over the enemy in Galicia.

The Russians' offensive against both Silesia and Posen have failed utterly, it is stated, and now the enemy is in full retreat from the province. The reports that Austria won a great victory over the Russians last night, were confirmed today by official dispatches.

SCARBOROUGH IS BEING SEARCHED FOR GERMAN SPIES; RECRUITING BOOMS

LONDON, Dec. 17.—Recruiting in the British army and navy was given a great boom by the German raid on Scarborough, Hartlepool and Whitby early yesterday morning. Yesterday afternoon and today immense crowds began flocking to the recruiting stations for enlistment.

The latest casualty list announced this afternoon declares that 75 civilians were killed by the exploding of shells in the three British sea coast cities and 267 wounded. Those killed and wounded were mostly women and children.

Today the British are searching Scarborough for German spies, who are believed to be in the city.

ROBBED MAIL TO GET MONEY TO BUY MEDICINE

The second find of any import along the North Concho river between Chadbourne and Randolph streets on the south side of the river occurred Monday, when C. G. Lovelace of 319 West Avenue A ran across a United States mail bag bearing the address, "Domestic, Orient, Texas, No. 4." The bag was half secluded in the brush when found and had been opened, papers being scattered on the ground. Mr. Lovelace was in the act of taking the bag to his house not far away when a man approached him who evidently was interested in the procedure. When told of the find the newcomer offered to take the parcel to the postoffice, as he was going anyway. This was refused, as the finder thought it might belong to the postman, not having examined the addresses as yet, and laid it on his front porch where the mail carrier would see it. The latter, B. L. Birt, took possession of the bag but before he had returned to the postoffice the thief had already confessed. He said he had gone after the bag but that Mr. Lovelace had found it and had refused to give it up. He stated that he had stolen it thinking that perhaps he would get money with which to have himself cured. He is in ill health and thought if he should be disappointed in getting money he could get in jail where he could get something to eat. He was lodged in jail awaiting trial.—San Angelo Standard.

CHRISTMAS SAVING CLUB FOR BALLINGER

SPOKANE, Dec. 17.—Approximately \$35,000 in Christmas spending money will be released in the next eight days by two Spokane banks to more than 1,000 forehanded persons who have been banking their pennies for 12 months that they might be prepared to play the role of Santa Claus this month.

The sum represents the 5, 10, 25, and 50 cent pieces deposited weekly by members of the Christmas savings clubs of the Fidelity National bank and the Spokane and Eastern Trust company. "Not only will these special deposits mean that hundreds of people will get Christmas remembrances who might otherwise have found empty stockings December 25," remarked R. L. Rutter, vice-president of the Spokane and Eastern Trust company, "but I am confident that an appreciable number of men and women are getting their start on the road to saving money as a result of these clubs. Bankers will do well to encourage the system."

TORREON IS BEING ATTACKED

SAN ANTONIO, Dec. 17.—Torreon is today being attacked by a large army of Carranzistas, according to a telegram received at headquarters of the Carranza junta here. The city is in danger of falling into the hands of General Carranza's forces.

Quiet prevails today at Naco, Ariz. Only intermittent firing took place during the forenoon.

The United States artillery is ready to fire on the first faction which sends bullets across the Arizona border into Naco.

LONDON, Dec. 17.—The condition of Kaiser Wilhelm today is more improved than at any time since he became attacked, according to advices reaching London from Berlin, where His Majesty is being attended. His condition is by no means alarming now, it is declared in the dispatches.

200 USE 1 BATHTUB IN CHICAGO SLUMS

CHICAGO, Dec. 17.—It's only a ten minute walk from the palaces of the wealthiest of Chicago's multi-millionaires to a block of wretched hovels that house the very dregs of the Windy City's slum district.

Sight-seeing "rubber-neck" autos along Lake Shore Drive, the "swellest" boulevard in the second city in America. On the east lie green parks and flowers and stretches of lake shore. On the west, the megaphone artist points out the palatial home of Mrs. Potter Palmer, wonder-spot for visitors, with its conservatory, and the home of other of the city's "elite."

Chicago avenue and Oak, Milton and Cambridge streets enclose the "poverty-stricken plot." Most of its inhabitants are Italians and a short distance away is "Death Corner" where Black Handers and sawed-off shotguns have claimed nearly a score of victims in recent years.

Swarthy-skinned, heavy mustached men congregate on the stoops or about the corner saloons; dirty, half-clad children crowd the sidewalks and streets and pallid-faced women peer out through smoky windows. Investigators found that 357 families, numbering 1,596 persons, 805 of whom are children, occupy 134 houses in this block, of which 107 are pronounced "rickety and dilapidated."

Children are being brought into the world and reared in thirty-six basement flats in this block, the investigators reported, some of them sleeping in closets without any sort of ventilation. One family of eight was found in three poorly lighted rooms, the entire family sleeping in one small, foul-smelling bedroom. "Only eight bathrooms were found in the whole block," reported the investigators, "a rate of 200 persons to each tub."

Walk straight east from the tenement district with its "one bathtub to 200 persons" and its street babies until you strike the lake shore and turn to the north for five blocks more. You'll encounter the most luxurious apartment buildings in Chicago—snowy marble hallways, gilded elevators. There's a marble bathtub to every bedroom and not a single baby playing in the street.

3 VESSELS ARE SUNK BY MINES

LONDON, Dec. 17.—An Austrian training ship was sunk by a mine in the Adriatic Sea, according to an announcement of the official press bureau here this afternoon. The entire number of cadets on board the vessel went down.

Three British steamers were sunk early today by mines off New Castle. The crews were saved by their life boats with the exception of six men who were unable to be accommodated.

OF INTEREST TO SCHOOL PATRONS

The mid-term examinations for all Ward schools and Central have been set for the week, January 11th to 15th. All new pupils are requested to enter on Monday January 18 so as to get an early classification to enable them to do good work the second term.

The High School examinations will be held February 1st to 5th. Pupils who have been irregular in attendance will be examined in the work of the entire term. Our University rating requires this of us.

Saturday, at our City Institute, the various classes of failures were discussed and the following points brought out: 1. Very many failures are caused from exceedingly irregular attendance. 2. In the High School there seems to be several causes for failure. Possibly the chief cause of unsatisfactory progress is the unwillingness to do anything that is real difficult, or that requires long, and persistent effort. In most cases where pupils seem not to make any marks in a given text, it is not a lack of mentality but sheer unwillingness to get down to hard work. Some of this class of pupils are mastering other branches that are far more difficult. And for that reason it

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would appear that concentrated effort does yield results in the so-called hard branches. Just here it is well to caution parents against giving their children permission to drop any study without first having seen us about the work they are doing. Nowhere in school law can you find that you have this right; and to do so is to encourage your child in lazy habits that will tell for shiftlessness later in life. Many say, "I do not wish to study this, it won't do me no good noway, as I do not expect ever to 'teach.'" The language just quoted is proof positive that we need education for its very culture value. Education is to fit the boy or the girl to be an intelligent citizen and to assume a positive, rather than negative, place in the affairs of state. All classes: farmers, merchants, manufacturers, have need for the young man or the young woman who can do something. No one has a greater contempt for the shiftless workman than the average farmer or merchant. Education broadens our vision, and enables the cultured man to see good in a fellow citizen who may not think as he does on some political questions. Parents should have a quiet room for study hour every night during the school week; they should see that real studying, and not desultory reading, is accomplished. Not to do this is to lay the foundation for "quitting" instead of (Continued on Last Page.)

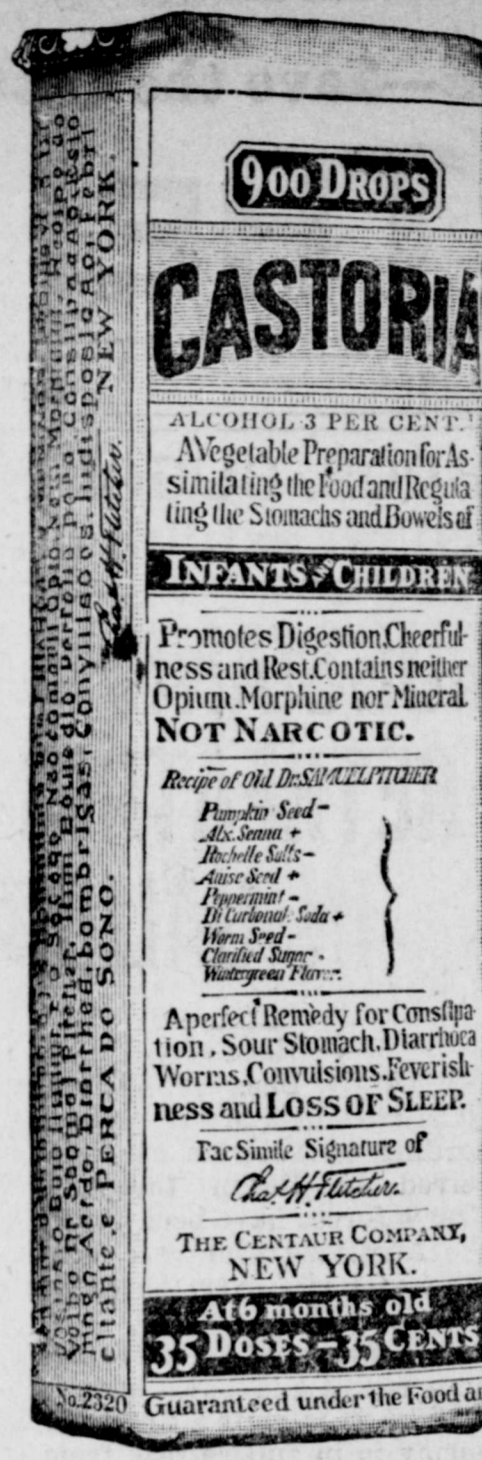
