Choose Colors for a Reason
Thinking of doing some painting, papering, or furnishing this summer? If so, choose colors for a reason... to get the special effects that you may want and at the same time provide a comfortable, pleasant background for everyday living.

Begin by analyzing the room. Its use, shape and exposure will determine colors best suited.

Decide how you want the room to look. Will it be light and gay, restful, or dramatic? Do you want it to be predominantly warm or cool?

A good color plan has few colors, usually no more than two or three... in different values and intensities. The best color schemes grow from a dark color, a light color and a bright color. Black, white and gray are not considered colors, but are often used to give a needed accent of light and dark.

Choose your favorite color if you do not need to consider the color or colors of furnishings which you must keep. Or select a picture or print which has your chosen colors and plan your scheme from that.

Good proportion of the different colors is important. This means that your color scheme will be definitely dark or light and that eight warm or cool colors will predominate. Proportions of 60 percent of area for one color, 30 percent for a second and 10 percent for accent.

Judge John Hart, who recently announced that he would be a candidate for re-election as County Judge of Eastland County, has issued a formal statement in connection with his candidacy. The statement follows:

In making my announcement for re-election as County Judge of Eastland County, I wish to express my heartfelt thanks and deep appreciation for the confidence you have shown me in the past by trusting me with the duties of County Judge, one of the most important offices of your County Government. I shall always be grateful to my many friends and the people of Eastland County who have been so loyal and helpful to me since I became your County Judge, and too, I deeply appreciate the cooperation shown me as County Judge by the members of the Commissioners Court and the other officials, their deputies and members of the County.

When I became County Judge your County was indebted to the tune of \$708,190.00

On Jan. 1st this year the County was in debt only \$270,336.00

The County had in cash when I became County Judge \$240,675.20

The County had in cash January 1, 1958 \$336,684.21

When I became County Judge we had in the Road and Bridge fund (including the four Commissioners precinct funds) \$69,001.26

On Jan. 1st this year 1958 we had in the Road and Bridge fund (including the four Commissioners precinct funds) \$176,905.55

We owed on the Court-house when I became County Judge \$150,000.00

We have paid off and have the money in the bank to pay all but \$10,000.00

You can see that Eastland County is better off financially than it has been in years and years.

bonded indebtedness within the very near future.

As budget officer, in preparing the budget each year, my chief aim has been to balance expenditures with collections, and to allot the funds to the several services on the basis of actual need for each service to be performed.

As County Judge I have done my very best to help the elderly people of our county, especially the ones who are surviving on

what little pension check they receive. We have helped them with medical aid, hospital care and also other people of our county who are less fortunate than we.

Since I have become County Judge and chairman of the Commissioner's Court, we have helped our ex-soldier boys and their families every way that we could. And by the appointment of County Veteran Service Officers, these officers have brought in last year alone \$178,200.00 to the needy Veterans and their families of this county NOT as a LOAN to be paid back to the government, but money paid to them for disabilities or injuries incurred while serving the Armed Forces of our Country.

It's the duty of the County Judge to handle the Juveniles of the County. Most of these unfortunate delinquent children are from broken homes or have been neglected.

Having reared four children, and having spent some time in the school room, I naturally have sympathy for a delinquent child. When these boys or girls are brought into Court, I have four or five good men including a Minister, to be at the hearing and we all decide what is best for the child.

As County Judge, I have given my full support to the activities of the 4 H and H. D. Club work which is developing the best resources of our county, 630 of our fine boys and girls, to become real leaders and professional people of our country.

I consider this the best investment the County has made in securing the County Agent and his Assistant and the Home Demonstration Agent and her assistant, to teach and work with these youngsters to become real citizens, they are doing a great work.

The Commissioners' Court has had fine cooperation from all State and Federal agencies, especially has the State Highway Commission been very cooperative to Eastland County, in allotting the County its full share of money to build roads.

I am asking you to re-elect me your County Judge, that we may finish the program of financing which we have in progress, more especially, to free our county of all bonded indebtedness.

I am making this race for my own merits and achievements, and not for any special group or certain individuals, and if re-elected County Judge I will treat the Citizens from all parts of the County alike.

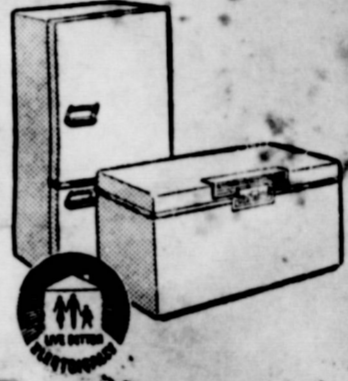

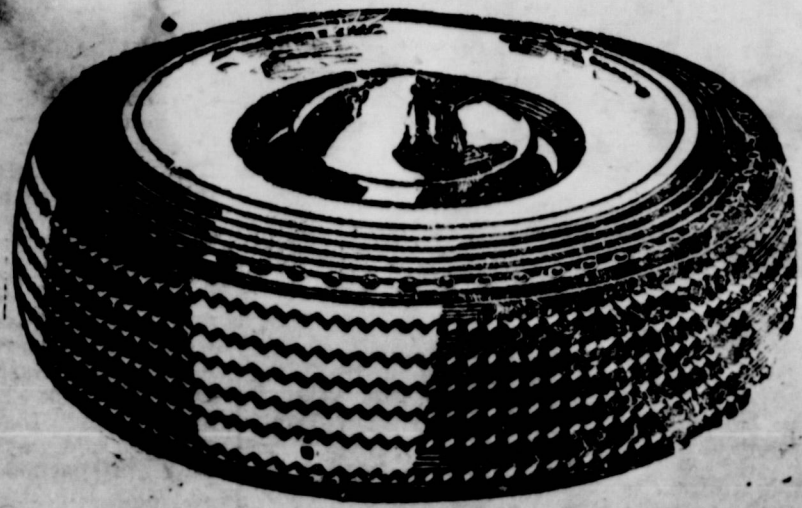

When you place the colors in a room, choose the color for the largest area first . . . floor covering, walls and large upholstered pieces. In most cases, these

should be your most livable colors, or colors that are greyed in intensity. Next, choose colors for small upholstery and the window treatment. This treatment may be a blend of the room colors, or match or contrast with the walls. Lastly choose your colors for accessories and small areas . . . Pillows, lamps, ash trays, etc. Usually, this accent color is the brightest color.

One good plan is to have the ceiling of the lightest color, the walls a little darker, and the floor darker than the walls. Then use medium to bright colors in upholstery, slip-cover materials, small accessories, and sometimes in draperies, and use dark-toned furniture woods. Another good plan is to have the walls medium or dark, the ceiling lighter, and the floor still lighter. The furnishings against the medium or dark walls can then be of the light toned woods, light-colored fabrics, and light, bright colors in the small accessories such as vases, lamps, and flowers.

A room looks best when the colors of walls and draperies are not too different in tone. If either one attracts too much attention then the balance in the room is upset and the color scheme is spoiled.

Walls that have figured paper need plain-color draperies to make an interesting contrast. When walls are plain, draperies of the same color or a little lighter or darker than the walls are restful. A third plan is to choose figured draperies with a background color like that of the walls, or with the most important color pattern the same as the plain wall color.

When you place the colors in a room, choose the color for the largest area first... floor covering, walls and large upholstered pieces. In most cases, these

should be your most livable colors, or colors that are greyed in intensity. Next, choose colors for small upholstery and the window treatment. This treatment may be a blend of the room colors, or match or contrast with the walls. Lastly choose your colors for accessories and small areas... Pillows, lamps, ash trays, etc. Usually, this accent color is the brightest color.

One good plan is to have the ceiling of the lightest color, the walls a little darker, and the floor darker than the walls. Then use medium to bright colors in upholstery, slip-cover materials, small accessories, and sometimes in draperies, and use dark-toned furniture woods. Another good plan is to have the walls medium or dark, the ceiling lighter, and the floor still lighter. The furnishings against the medium or dark walls can then be of the light toned woods, light-colored fabrics, and light, bright colors in the small accessories such as vases, lamps, and flowers.

A room looks best when the colors of walls and draperies are not too different in tone. If either one attracts too much attention then the balance in the room is upset and the color scheme is spoiled.

Walls that have figured paper need plain-color draperies to make an interesting contrast. When walls are plain, draperies of the same color or a little lighter or darker than the walls are restful. A third plan is to choose figured draperies with a background color like that of the walls, or with the most important color pattern the same as the plain wall color.
