Geology Professor Traces Longhorn Cavern Formation

BURNET — Texas Longhorn Cavern, a spectacular scenic masterpiece of Nature, was at least a million years in the making, geologists have estimated.

The huge cavern is awesome evidence of the changes wrought through the ages by variations in climate, earth movements, the rise and fall of the seas and the slow solution of limestone by water.

Today Longhorn Cavern, located near Burnet in the Highland Lakes region northwest of Austin, is one of the state's favorite attractions for tourists and sightseers. Guided tours are conducted daily through the explored portions of the cave, which is one of the largest in the world.

Richard W. Rush, assistant professor of geology at the University of Texas, has traced the sequence of events which led to the development of the cavern from the time when Texas lay beneath a huge sea, approximately a half-billion years ago.

The stone in which the cavern was eventually carved out was formed from limy muds deposited countless centuries this mud deposit gradually rose out of the

Notaries Public To Be Approved By County Clerk

Secretary of State Zollie Steakley has announced that he will reappoint persons now holding notary public commissions but that such persons must re-qualify by the filing of a new oath and bond with the County Clerk of his residence between June 1, 1957, and June 10, 1957.

Steakley emphasized that notaries public should not send requests for reappointment or for commissions directly to the Secretary of State. The law specifically requires the County Clerks to approve notary bonds.

Any person not now a notary public who desires appointment should apply to his County Clerk between May 1, 1957, and May 20, 1957. Application during this period will assure prompt attention before the rush procedure of reappointing present notaries.

Secretary of State Steakley further pointed out that each person applying for a commission as a notary public must be at least 21 years of age and a resident of the county for which he is appointed. The exact name and permanent address of the applicant must be furnished the County Clerk.

Fifty Tracts Of Land To Be Sold By Land Board

AUSTIN, May 2. — Fifty tracts of land, mostly in Central Texas and the upper Valley region, will be offered for sale on June 6 by the Veterans' Land Board. Forfeited earlier, they were not because purchasers were not keeping up payments, the land total 3,003.44 acres. They are located in 25 Texas counties. Nine of the fifty tracts offered

are in Medina County, just west of San Antonio. This is the largest county offering. Nearby Zavalla County has five of the forfeited tracts.

Forfeited lands to be offered for sale in East and Northeast are in Lamar, Red River, Hopkins, and Rusk Counties.

In Central Texas, forfeited tracts are in Erath, Comanche, Brown, Hamilton, Coryell, Lampasas, McCullough, Williamson, and Bastrop Counties.

Upper Valley lands are in Medina, Karnes, Frio, Bexar, Zavalla, Maverick, and Dimmit Counties.

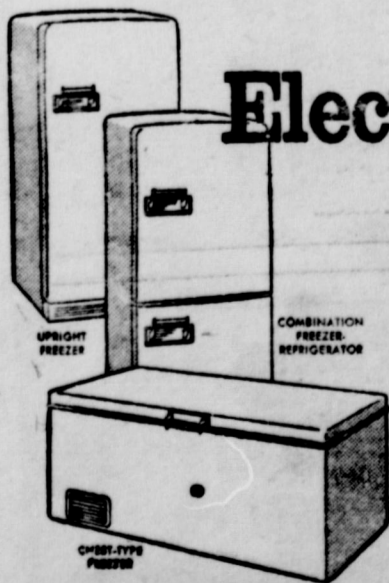
