

Senators Pomeromo of Ohio and Beckham, of Kentucky and Harrison of Mississippi, defended the treaty and the league of nations, declaring that the league was necessary to enforce the terms of the treaty, and preserve peace. The defenders pointed out that those opposing the league of nations had failed to offer any better plan.




