

THE WELFARE of Texas and Texans has gone and will always go hand in hand with the welfare of Texas railroads. Their dependency upon each other is absolute.

In 1929 Texas railroads gave employment to 82,956 em ployes, to whom they paid annually \$126,674,543 in salaries and wages. In 1980 this number decreased to 70,739 while the payroll declined to \$109,892,226. In 1981 the number of employes fell to \$7,098 and the payroll to \$89,505,918

This represents a decrease of more than \$87,000,000 in purchasing power in Texas communities. There has been a corresponding decrease in purchase of materials and supplies by Texas railroads. The ability to have maintained railroad payrolls and purchases would have been a very important factor in overcoming the present trying

The decline in railroad payrolls and purchases is due only in part to economic conditions. The revenues of the railroads have been affected not only by business conditions but to a very large extent by ions of traffic to trucks and buses using the public highways in competition with the railroads

> • The time has come when the people of Texas must decide whether the traffic of this state can best be carried by the railroads, noing facilities which they built and maintain at their own expense, or by trucks and buses using the highways built and maintained at the taxpayers' expense.


