## REFUSE TO STOP SCANDAL PROBE

(By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, April 7. -Secretary Weeks of the war department declined to grant the request of Mrs. Edwin Randel that he cancel the order directing that an investigation into the controversy between her husband Captain Edwin Randel and Col. Arthur Conger, commanding the 20th Infantry at Camp Travis, San Antonio. Mr. Weeks said that the case was of much broader importance than a personal difference between the two army of ficers. He said that the publicity given the case has created in the minds of the public a serious reflection upon those connected with the military service, and that he wished to know all the facts and take such final action as the evidence justified.

The suit was dismissed yesterday after a conference between attorneys for Randel and Conger, and both sides declined to state why the case was dropped.
