

### Some Figures on the Proposed Irrigation Project

An analysis of the cost of the proposed irrigation project discloses some interesting figures, as shown below.

We have had the taxable values of the proposed district checked up, based on valuations for 1922 state and county taxes, and

Tetal valuations in proposed district \_\_\_\_\$3,763,720.00 Total valuations for Ballinger \_\_\_\_\_ 1,858,520.00 Total valuations for Miles \_\_\_\_\_ 305,200.00

Total valuations exclusive of Ballinger and Miles \_\_\_\_\_ 1,600,000,00

Suppose the proposed district should be incorporated and the board of directors selected should RIND it to be a FEASIBLE and PRACTICABLE project, and \$5,000,000.00 in 6% forty year bonds be voted to develop it. The annual interest on the bonds would be \$300,000.00 and \$125,000.00 each year would have to be set aside as a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, a total of \$425,000. 00 a year to be paid.

A tax of \$11.00 per hundred on above mentioned valuations would raise \$414,009.20, of which Balllinger would pay \$204,437.20 and Miles would pay \$33,572.00; leaving \$176,000.00 to be paid by he district outside of Ballinger and Miles.

(Under the present law if a majority city vote is against incorporation of the district, such city vote is disregarded and the city so voting excluded.

If Miles should drop out and Ballinger remain in, the total values would be reduced to \$3,458,520, and a tax of \$12.00 per hundred would raise \$415,022,40 and Ballinger's part of this would be \$223,022.00, leaving \$192,000.00 to be paid outside Ballinger.

If Ballinger should drop out and Miles remain in, the total walues would be reduced to \$1,905,200.00 and a tax of \$22.00 per bundred would raise \$419,144.00, of which Miles would pay \$67,-144.00 and the remainder of such district \$252,000.00.


