



SAN ANGELO BASEBALL GRAND-STAND BURNS

The grand stand at the Fort Concho baseball park in San Angelo was destroyed by fire Tuesday night. The fire is believed to have started from a cigarette stub falling thru the seats into the concession room below. Harry D. Wright, contractor, was the principal loser, his loss figuring about \$996, which was in the form of a mechanic's lien on the grandstand.
