MANY PAY TRIBUTE TO DEPARTED CITIZEN

A procession of autos almost half a mile long, carrying the sorrowing friends, followed the remains of B. F. Kemp from the late home of the deceased to the Old Runnels cemetery Thursday afternoon, where the large crowd gathering to pay a tribute of respeet to the departed citizen. The large tabernacle was filled with people, and many stood around on the outer edge as Dr. Alvin Swindell reviewed the life of Mr. Kemp and referred to his death as a loss to the nation, to the state and to the community.

The funeral was held at 3:30, and the remains laid to rest in the Old Runnels cemetery, the floral offering marking to some degree the high esteem in which the deceased was held by his friends and neighbors.

Mr. Kemp died after a two days' illness, being cut down suddenly at the age of sixty-two years. He passed away at 6:00 o'clock Wednesday evening in a local hospital.

The minister in paying a tribute to the deceased, said that Mr. Kemp was a man who always filled his place as a citizen, and never shirked a duty. He was a man of few words, but what he said could always be counted as one hundred per cent true. He was a member of the Baptist church, and in the language of the preacher who conducted the funeral services, his name is an honor to his children.

#### Conveyance in Motion

Abstaining from reading in the subway is one way to prolong life, according to Dr. Frank J. Monaghan, commissioner of public health for New York city. Take a look around any subway car, he says. Scarcely one person in five is not reading. Almost as many newspapers as passengers enter at each station. These papers are read closely, painstakingly, by the holder, sitting, standing or wavering with the motion of the car.

"Every time the train lurches or jerks many tiny muscles are kept busy adjusting the eyes to the vibration," he explained to the New York Times "This is why it is injurious to use the eyes on a conveyance in motion. Also, the lighting is apt to be extremely poor. If this sort of thing is kept up eye strain and possibly nerve strain will result. Blurred vision may follow; and in the course of years the eye-

"But the actual injury to the eyes is not the whole story. Few persons realize how the eyes are tied up with the rest of the body and the rest of the body on them. 
