Couple Found at Home of Yates' Father Near Winters

Acting upon a telegram received from detectives, the sheriff's department of Runnels county placed Rev. Joe Yates, a Methodist minister, in jail at Ballinger Monday morning about 10:00 o'-

Sheriff J. P. Flynt received a message notifying him that Rev. Yates was supposed to be in this county, and the sheriff immediately notified Deputy Sheriff C. R. Hightower at Winters, and the deputy sheriff went to the home of the minister's father, R. A. Yates, a pioneer citizen of Winters, where he found Rev. Yates and immediately brought him to Ballinger and placed him behind the bars.

It is alleged that Rev. Yates is wanted in Oklahoma for running away with a 14-year-old school girl, Miss Georgia Fields, who was a Sunday school pupil in Rev. Yates' church at Alluwe, Oklahoma. A. W. Field, father of the girl, has sworn to a complaint in the district court at Nowata, Oklahoma, charging Yates with abduction.



Once playing a leading part in a brilliant world drama. later we find him going about the commonplace duties of a landholder. clad in a favorite old tramping suit and a faded hat. 
