

COLORED WOMAN DIES SUDDENLY

Green, janitor for the First National Bank, and one of the best known colored women in the city, died suddenly at her home about 10:30 Wednesday night. She was 44 years of age and is survived by her husband and two ehildren.

Deceased was up and about her work as usual Wednesday, and became ill after retiring. A few minutes before 10:00 o'clock she called her husband and told him she was sick. Richard got up and administered medicine, and his wife asked him to call a doctor. She died before the physician arrived and in about fifty minutes after being stricken ill.

The woman was well known among the white families of the eity, having worked for a number of them. She had been married to Richard about 22 years, and came here from Arkansas in 1917, after her husband had lived here for some time.

The remains were prepared for burial and shipped to Texarkana, Arkansas, Thursday afternoon, accompanied by her husband.
