GETS BOATS AND RUM AFTER RUNNING FIGHT

(By Associated Press)
 GALVESTON, Jan. 13.—Two rum ships, three armored motor trucks and about 800 cases of liquor and two men were captured by the United States coast guards after a gun battle about seven miles East of San Luis Pass on Galveston Island last night.

The guards crept up on the smugglers from the prairie and opened fire with rifles. The fire was returned with pistols. After a sharp firing the men in charge of the cargo of liquors escaped in automobiles. There were about a dozen smugglers in the party, and the officers believe that several were injured in the shooting.

HOUGHTON WILL GO TO LONDON

(By Associated Press)
 WASHINGTON, January 13.—Unless there is a change in the present plans, Ambassador Houghton at Berlin will succeed Frank Kellogg as ambassador to London, when Kellogg becomes Secretary of State. No announcement of the selection of Kellogg's successor is expected immediately, however, and it is still possible that the choice may fall to someone else.

With the exception of Secretary Hughes, who has resigned, and Secretary Gore, of West Virginia, who leaves the agricultural department to become governor of his state on March 4th, no other change is expected to take place on that date in the Coolidge cabinet. Secretary Davis, at the request of the president, has withdrawn his resignation.

WASHINGTON, January 13.—Allison B. Houghton, of New York, ambassador to Germany, has been definitely selected by President Coolidge to succeed Ambassador Kellogg at London.

WU REGAINS CONTROL OVER SHANGHAI

 SHANGHAI, Jan. 13.—The control of Shanghai, the gateway port to China, over which the Peking government and General Wu, since deposed, started an aggressive war some months ago, passed back to the adherents of General Wu today.

More than seven thousand vanquished troops of General Chang, rival leader, were disarmed, and admitted to internment in the French and international settlements.

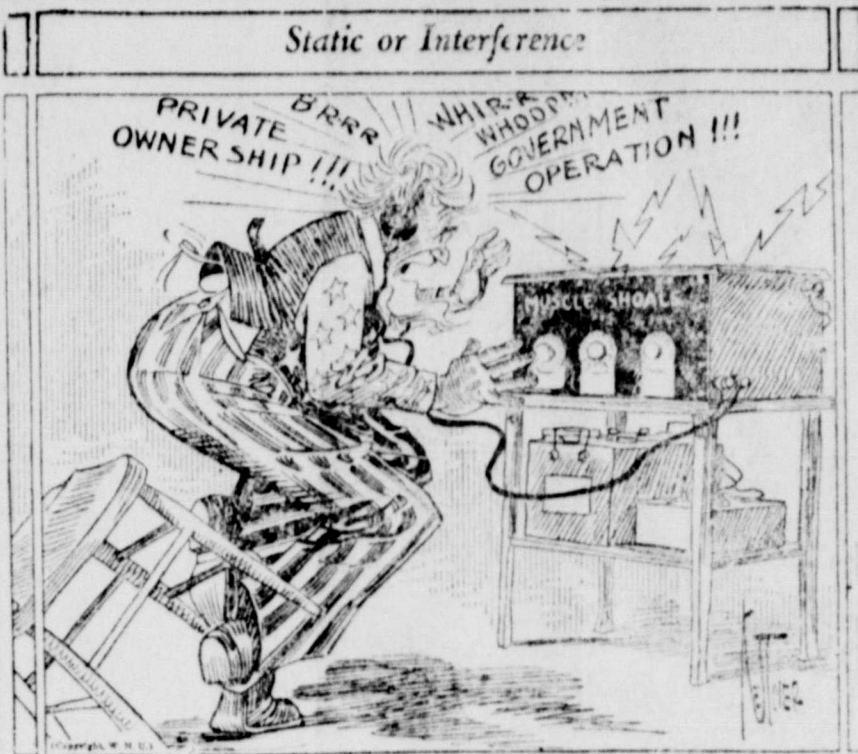

SANTA FE MAY TAKE OFF PULLMAN

(San Angelo Standard)
 Travel between San Angelo and Fort Worth and Dallas on the Pullman operated by the Santa Fe has fallen off to such an extent that discontinuance of the sleeper is being considered, Oscar Nelson, of Houston, traveling passenger agent for the Santa Fe, advised in San Angelo the middle of the week.

The Board of City Development and business men individually urged thru Mr. Nelson that the Santa Fe either continue its present service or switch the sleeper to San Antonio or Houston. Passengers from San Angelo and all points on the Santa Fe between this city and Temple have to change cars in Temple in going to Austin or San Antonio, and visa versa, while passengers from points between San Angelo and Brownwood and Houston, Galveston and other South Texas points have to change cars at Temple, unless they are fortunate enough to obtain at Brownwood berths on the Santa Fe train from California.

The Santa Fe has long contended that the number of fares between this section of West Texas and Austin and San Antonio in one direction and Houston and Galveston in the other will not justify the operation of a through sleeper. The answer of local interests is that with the service afforded good business can not be expected and that the inauguration of through Pullman service would do much toward increasing business.



SCORE KILLED IN TRAIN WRECK

 BERLIN, Jan. 3.—More than a score of lives are known to have been lost when a train en route from Berlin to Cologne crashed into a train standing in the station at Heerne, Westphalia, today. Three cars were completely demolished, killing or injuring many persons.

Dispatches received here said that twenty-one bodies had been removed from the debris.

YOUNG LADY FREEZES DEATH

 DENVER, Colo., Jan. 13.—Miss Arnes Vaille, assistant secretary of the Chamber of Commerce of Denver, was found dead at the summit of Long's Peak last night. The young lady froze to death.

Walter Kloner, a companion of the young lady who went on a mountain climb with her, was rescued and is reported safe.

12 YEAR OLD BOY STEALS AUTOMOBILE

An envelope addressed to Mrs. H. A. Wimberly, found beneath the seat cushion, was the means by which Deputy Sheriff Smith of Concho county Thursday located the owner of a Ford coupe, missing at San Angelo. The car was taken from in front of Immaculate Conception Academy on East Beauregard some time before noon and a few hours later Dr. Wimberly received a phone call from Deputy Sheriff Smith at Eden advising that his car was found abandoned seven miles East of Eden on the road leading to Brady. Sheriff Bob Hewitt accompanied Dr. Wimberly to Eden, where possession of the Ford was regained. A 12-year-old boy suspected of the theft had not been arrested early Friday—San Angelo Standard.

PIONEER CITIZEN IS HERE ON VISIT

J. T. Arnold stopped off here Tuesday for a visit with his brother-in-law, D. C. Underwood, while en route to Bradshaw to see his brother, J. S. Arnold. Mr. Arnold is 82 years of age, but declares that he feels sixteen. He is healthy and active, and at present is engaged in work for the Salvation Army, and travels around over the country with as much spry as any of the young men.

Mr. Arnold was in the ranger service in 1870, and is now drawing a pension for services rendered on the frontier of Texas, and has seen some interesting times in his life. While he will pass his eighty-second birthday on St. Patrick's Day, he can read without glasses, and looks to be good for many years of service in the work he is now doing.

TEXAS LEGISLATURE CONVENES TODAY

WILLING TO DIVIDE WATER WITH U.S.

(By Associated Press)
 MEXICO CITY, Jan. 13.—Mexico is willing to discuss the question of distribution of waters of the Rio Grande along the lines of the Colorado River agreement, according to instructions sent to the Mexican embassy in Washington by the foreign office.

Mexico believes that the International Boundaries Commission should settle the question. President Coolidge recently designated three special commissioners to arrange with the Mexican commission for an equitable use of the waters of the Rio Grande below Fort Quitman, Texas, and the matter was taken up with the Mexican government.

OPTIMISTIC OVER OIL PROSPECTS

W. O. Shultz was in the city Monday from his ranch near Millersview. Mr. Shultz is planning to put a pretty good bunch of cattle on feed in the near future, and will probably bring a big bunch to Ballinger to fatten for the market.

Mr. Shultz is very optimistic over the outlook for an oil field to be developed in this part of the country, and indicated that he would have some good news to put out in the near future, since a pipe line is to run within a few miles of the territory where he has been prospecting for oil, and where he has put down several test holes.

The pipe line will run a few miles North of the Shultz Ranch, or will be within easy reach of that territory in case a well should be drilled in, and the pipe line will cross the Russell Ranch where considerable development has been under way for some time.

 AUSTIN, Jan. 13.—The Thirty-Ninth Legislature of Texas opened promptly at noon today, when Secretary of State Hutchins called the House to order, and Lieutenant Governor Davids on performed a similar formality in the Senate. Both branches quickly got down to business.

AUSTIN, Jan. 13.—The Thirty-Ninth Texas Legislature, meeting today, faced the task of reconciling the conflicting forces in the speakership fight, and determining whether Gov. Neff's recess appointments shall be confirmed, and perfecting a working organization.

In both branches of the legislature the usual flood of bills is expected to be released as soon as the Senate and House is organized. At least one hundred measures are now ready for introduction in the House.

Prospects were good today that some time may be required to organize the House, because of the speakership fight. The Senate is already practically organized. A caucus was held last night at which time a slate of sub-ordinate officers were agreed upon, and this slate is expected to be adopted with little or no opposition.

FAILS TO FIND CHECK FORGER

Sheriff Earl McWilliams returned from Big Spring Monday afternoon without making any arrest in connection with the passing of a number of bad checks here and at Winters by a young woman. The sheriff spent several hours in Big Spring running down a clue on which he was working, but without any results. He is still working on the case, and it is only a question of time until someone will have to answer to fleeing a bank at Ballinger and one at Winters out of about \$300. The officers feel certain that the guilty party will be apprehended.

MOTOR TRIPS ABROAD A 1000 Year Old Castle

Warwick Castle at Warwick, England, an easy motor trip from London!

IT WAS Scott who said of Warwick Castle at Warwick, England, "the fairest monument of ancient and chivalrous splendor which yet remains unimpaired by time." This marvelous castle which has attracted hundreds of American motor tourists in England to Warwick, stands on a rock overlooking the Avon. It is said to have been founded in 915 by Ethelred, the daughter of Alfred. In the war with the barons in the time of Henry III it was destroyed except the towers.

Thomas de Beauchamp, in the reign of Edward III, restored and strengthened it and his son built Guy's Tower in 1394. James I gave it to Sir Fulke Greville, who spent 20,000 pounds—\$100,000—an enormous sum for that time—in repairing and adorning it. It has been the property of the Grevilles ever since.

The gardens surrounding the castle are worth travelling hundreds of miles to see.

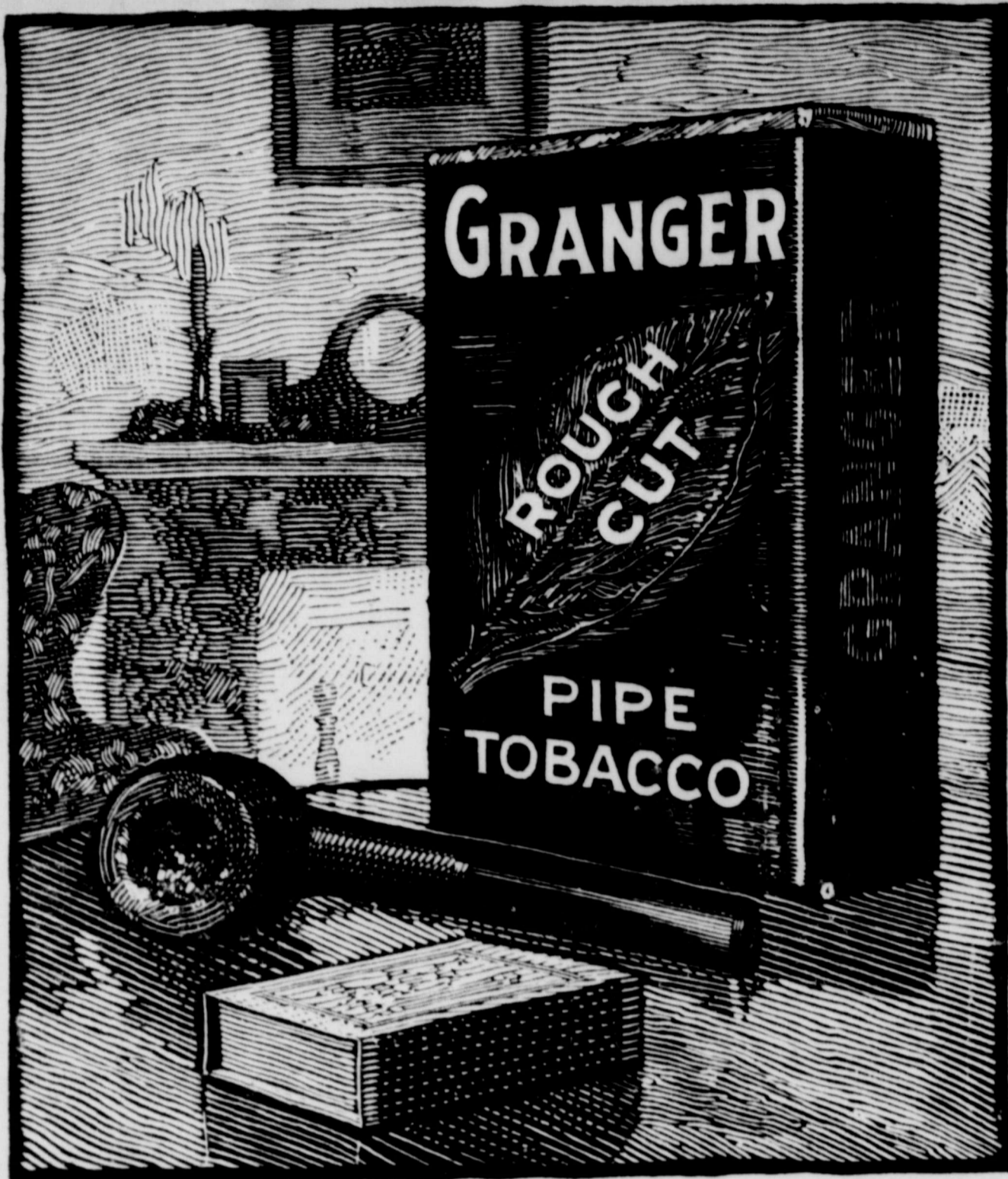

U. S. Dominates Market for Autos in Argentina

(By Associated Press)
BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 13.—The United States practically absorbed the importation of automobiles and motor trucks in Argentina in 1923, according to a report just issued by the Motor Car Importers Association. The report, which is based on official records, shows that out of a total of 30,024 automobiles that entered Argentina during the last year, 29,294 were of North American manufacture. The value of the cars amounted to 13,201,114 gold pesos, and to this sum must be added a further 3,750,779 gold pesos which is the value of motor car accessories imported during the same period. The report dwells on the con-

siderable development of the automobile trade in Argentina during the last year, saying that the increase of the importation was 52.2 per cent over 1922, when the trade reached its highest level. In the city of Buenos Aires there are at present 19,222 motorcars, compared with 5,824 in 1914. Americans Good Patrons of Paris London Air Route (By Associated Press) WASHINGTON, January 13.—Americans develop a penchant for flying when they get to Europe, according to Lieutenant John P. Van Zandt, of the United States air service, who has just returned from a 6,000 mile air trip through Europe studying development of commercial aero-

nautics. During the summer weeks 1,000 was overers leave London by plane for Paris, and the majority are American tourists. More than 35,000 Americans have flown between the British and French cap-

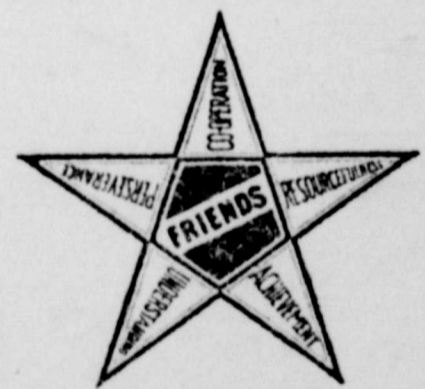

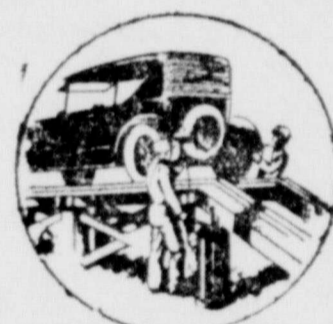

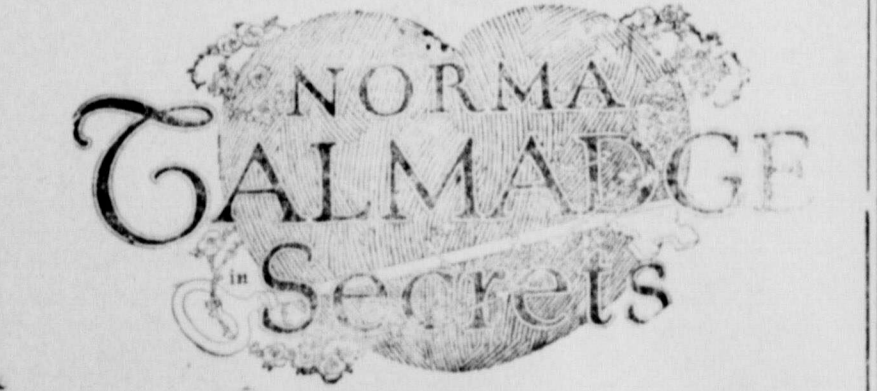

St. Louis Joins Cities Which "Say It With Architecture"

New Masonic Edifice Expresses City's Higher Aims

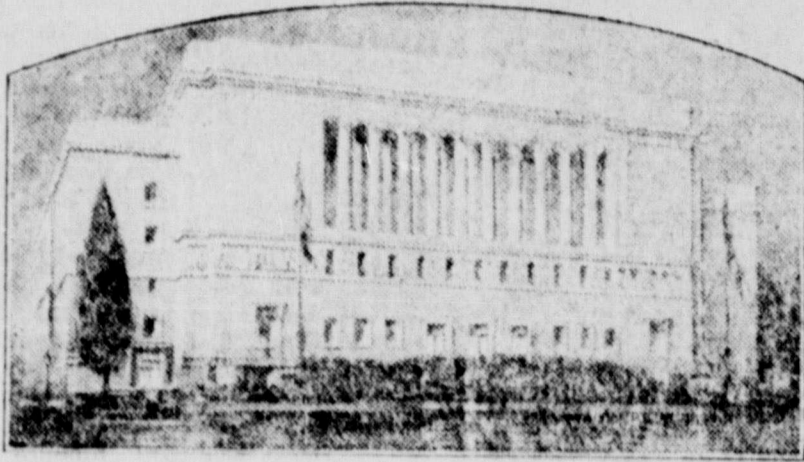
ANOTHER evidence of America's determination to "say it with architecture," and one of the most impressive, is in the erection of the new Scottish Rite Cathedral for the Valley of Missouri at St. Louis.

In design, plan and choice of materials the cathedral is in harmony with huge edifices planned in New York, Chicago, Pittsburgh and elsewhere to express the spirit of American cities and institutions.

Mammoth Interior

An auditorium that will seat three thousand persons, a kitchen and dining room that recall the spacious days of mediaeval Europe in their capacity for feeding thirty-five hundred persons at once, gigantic offices, corridors and initiation chambers are physically astounding. They are declared by the Masons to be merely incidental to the real purpose of the building, which is to "point to the growing interest in the higher life."

The Cathedral, faced with Bedford stone, looms 104 feet high and 235 feet wide on Lindell Boulevard. It is five stories high, but there is no way of telling this from the exterior. The stories are each unusually high. Above the third story, whose windows are recessed in a sculptured frieze 110 feet along the front, ten ionic columns rise for thirty-six feet. The surrounding lines of the building, as can be seen in the illustration, are classic Greek.



Tapestry Glass Vestibules

Sublimity speaks from the inside of the building as from the outside. Mounting the spreading granite steps, the visitor enters vestibule upon a corridor 155 feet long and 23 feet wide. To the left and right are offices of the functionaries of the order, whose names appear blasted onto the luxurious surface

of the same sort of glass as that used in the vestibules. Immediately ahead is the auditorium.

The auditorium contains a stage that will hold 480 men in military formation and whose proscenium width of 98 feet is greater than that of any stage in America. The auditorium itself is 165 feet wide, 130 feet long and 58 feet high. No pillar or support of any sort is visible.

Cost \$2,000,000

The auditorium strikes the keynote of the entire interior. Massiveness, dignity and sublimity are preserved throughout.

The cost of the building will be more than \$2,000,000 by the time its last detail is finished.

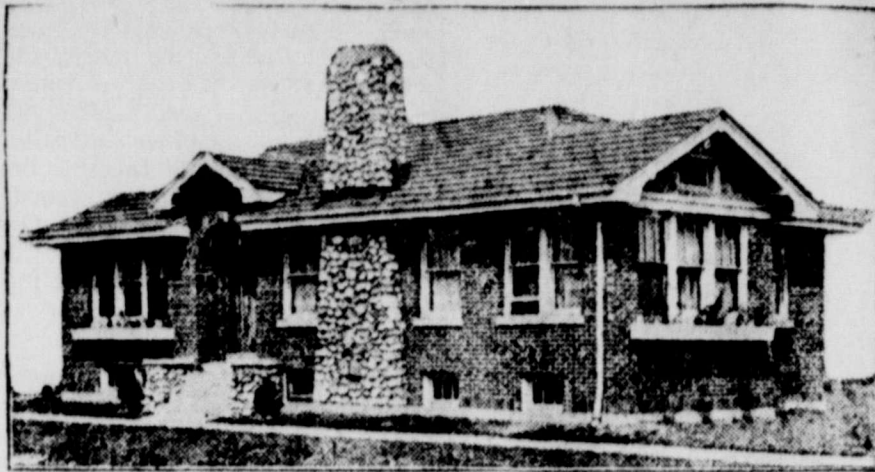

Charming and Unusual Brick Home Borrows Apartment House Ideas

Apartment builders, when apartment building was rather an experimental proposition, were forced to take their ideas for the most part from those developed from years of experience in building separate homes.

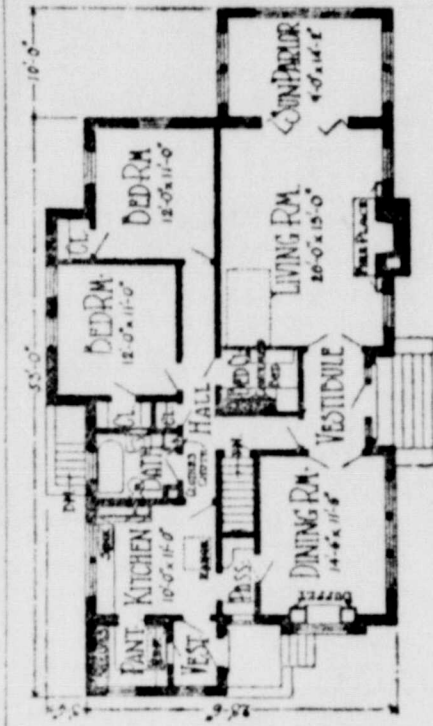
This is exactly what has been done in this charming and unusual home of brick, for while the floor plans show only five rooms, the home really has the efficiency of a six-room house through the use of a clever bed, such as are so generally utilized in the planning of modern apartments.

The home as shown is designed for a corner lot, with the unusual arched entrance in the center of the long side of the building. The fireplace chimney of field stone is a decorative touch.

The arched entryway opens into a vestibule which gives access to the living room, the dining room and a hall which leads to the other parts of the home.

But the center of interest in this home is the large and very "livable"

living room, with its size increased by the dimensions of the sun parlor which partially is part of the room. And entirely out of sight and detracting nothing from the room is a bed



which can be utilized when needed, solving the problem of the spare room without the extra expense. The arrangement of the two bed rooms, the kitchen and the efficient pantry will repay careful study.

Moderate Priced House Is Now the Chief Need

That the need of today is for homes of moderate price and moderate size, is the opinion of William Elder, Indianapolis real estate man. During the times of apparent unrest in business, the greater part of the building population is beginning to be dubious as to the benefit in building houses.

"Today the thing needed is homes of moderate price," he said, "so that the ordinary working man who has only the average chance of paying his debts will be able to pay for his home. It is a long pull for the average man to pay for a home on terms regardless of the price. A house is not like a piece of furniture that can be bought one week and paid for the next. A house takes time, as anything that runs in the thousands of dollars does."

If a man has the "payment habit," which results in his spending a dollar of his pay roll here and another there, the profitability of his buying a home on payments is doubtful, Elder said. It sometimes proves to make the home buyer wish to save his money, but this is seldom the case with the man who spends all his money this way, he said.

If all the prospective home buyers who are holding back because they want houses of the quality that now cost \$10,000 or more, would be satisfied with houses of the bungalow type, to cost not more than \$5,000 or so, and would go ahead and build them, Mr. Elder said, industry would be tremendously stimulated.

Concrete Block Used Now for Building Entire House

In addition to its strength concrete block first became popular with builders because of the fine appearance of the rock-face block in basement walls, its convenience in laying and economy. Providing as it does from 20 per cent to 50 per cent dead air space, a concrete wall affords greater protection from the cold than solid masonry, and it will not sweat like solid masonry.

Many residences have been built entirely of concrete block construction in the walls and they make extremely comfortable homes, splendidly protected from the cold in winter and the heat of summer.

Small Suite Houses

In many cities the house built after the manner of the small apartment suite is popular. Wall beds are provided in several rooms and are cheaper than building more rooms.

Lighting Service Rooms

In the kitchen, pantry and cellar it is essential to provide direct lighting fixtures, so that light can be thrown down upon the working plane.

Things About Plumbing Householder Should Know

The trap is a curved pipe permitting the last of a flow of water to remain in the pipe to prevent a back flow of sewer gas into the house. There are many different types. The grease trap is used to separate grease from water in large or institutional kitchens and saves plumbing bills. Traps must be in plain sight under the sink.

The house sewer is that part of the main drain or sewer extending from a point two feet outside of the outer front wall of the building, vault or area, to its connection with the public sewer, private sewer or cesspool.

The house drain is that part of the horizontal drain and its branches inside the walls of a building, vault or area and often dug to and connecting with the house sewer.

The soil line is the vertical line of pipe having outlets above the flow of the first story for the toilet.

The waste line is the vertical line of pipe having outlets above the first floor for fixtures other than the toilet.

The vent pipe is applied to any special pipe provided to ventilate the system of piping and prevent trap siphoning and back pressure. Fresh air outlets and main traps are to prevent odors and gases entering the house from the sewer. From the Designer Magazine.

Weather Stripping Way to Protect Furnishings

An all-warm house in winter time is a practical impossibility without weather-stripping. Buildings settle even on the best foundations; doors and windows adjust themselves; air passages appear, and drafts and heat waste result. Realizing this, many inventive minds have developed weather-strips for doors and windows calculated to be practical and efficient, and last indefinitely.

In the old days the weather-strip was considered simply a cold weather advantage. Now, however, they have been found as necessary and effective in excluding dust and dirt. Good weather-stripping of doors and windows protects rugs, drapes, wall paper, painting and good furniture against soiling and deterioration from the dust, smoke, soot and dirt sifting in from the outside.

Let us consider the scientific basis of weather-stripping. It is a fact that burning fuel at full blast "spots" heat at certain points. These points are too hot, while exposed places near doors and windows and the areas fairly distant from the heating plant are cold.

Two Baths Better

For the small additional expense the family of any size will find it a great convenience, especially when several members of the family must be ready to leave the house at about the same hour, to have two bathrooms.

Basement Convenience

If possible, plan the house with an outside basement entrance for convenience in the laundry and in emergency cases.

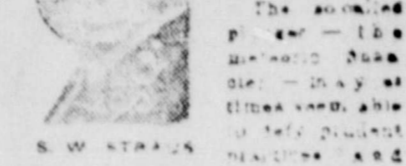

**SAVING MONEY AS VITAL
TO SUCCESS AS EARNING IT**

NO matter how shrewd a man may be or how keenly developed his instincts for acquiring wealth, he will never be successful unless an element of thrift is woven into all his activities.



The successful man—the man who has made his money—does not say as these men do, "I have made my money by the principles of thrift. However, such success is not permanent. Wealth gained by a sort of 'hard' demand, rather than through the working out of sound business practices, nearly always passes transitorily."

Back of this has caused them financial failure, then again, else. How many men there are today who would have become wealthy had they only known how to save money! During the course of their careers they have earned large sums, but these have slipped through their fingers from day to day. They had the natural gift of making money, just as their successful rivals, but they lacked the quality of permanent success—which is thrift.

The majority of men who have built up great fortunes, though they have in many instances risen rapidly, owe their success primarily to thrift. It was this that gave them the start they needed, and it was the development of this characteristic that impeded the serious nation of courage and sound judgment without which there can be no substantial success in business matters.

Although the ability to make money is, to a considerable extent, a matter of natural aptitude, the still more important character element of thrift can be acquired by anyone. There is no excuse for not saving money.

Thriftlessness is an indication of weakness. It is indicative of character. Thriftlessness indicates one has the mentality of the last penny of money. It is the only special principle that is not taught in school.

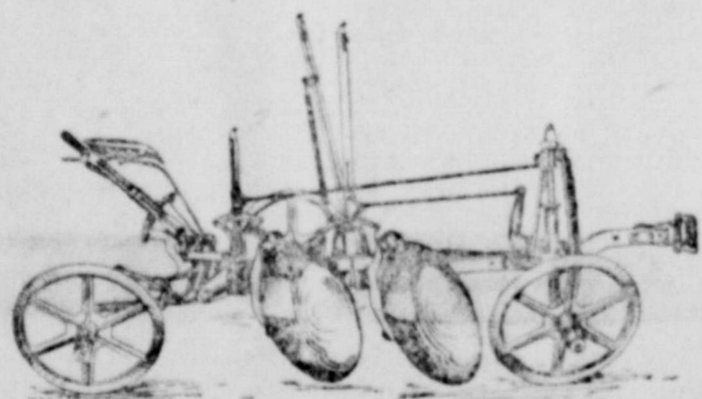
