



ACK of care which leads to accidents is productive of many forms of waste. Even human lives are often sacrificed on tha

proper precau-A man who is affiliated with one of the nation's leading construction organizations recently made a state-

altar of im-

ment that is orthy of more than passing attention. He stated that in connection with building operations 75 per cent of all accidents are preventable. He also said that out of all preventable mishaps in that field of activity only 20 to 25 per cent can be prevented through mechanical devices. The remaining 75 to \$0 per cent of all preventable accidents in connection with building work can be forestalled only by education.

What is true in building operations is true in greater or less degree in all lines of work

The construction industry is, according to some statistics, responsible for only about 18 per cent of all accidents. It is safe to say that the percentage of preventability does not differ greatly in different

lines of occupation. What an enormous field for the prevention of fatalities and the elimination of waste thus lies withto the domain of education! Safety and thrift are closely al-

It is just as advisable to take no risks physically as it is to take no risks financially.

Don't take chances with yourself or with your money. Recklessness is a flagrant violation of the practices of thrift.






