34 MEN BURIED ALIVE BY EXPLOSION IN MINE

FAIRMONT, West Virginia, March 18.—There is hope of reaching thirty-four men who are entombed in Mine No. 41 of the Bethlehem Mine Corporation at Barrackville, three miles West of here some time this afternoon. Hope of saving the men was expressed by rescue parties who entered the mine this morning.

(By Associated Press) CHICAGO, March 18 .- An application for a receivership for the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Company was filed in the United States district court today. The receivership eliminates a month's uncertainty marked by a steady and heavy decline in market quotations of the road's securities as to refinancing of \$48,000,000 worth of four per cent bonds due next June.




