NEW YORK, May 7.-Two observers for the New York Evening World took a seaplane trip over the scene of warfare between the coast guard vessels and rum boats on "rum row" today.

The newspaper's observers say that approximately thirty liquor ships are at anchor from eighteen to thirty-five miles from shore, and that each of the rum boats was under close scrutiny and constant guard by two coast guard boats.

NEW YORK, May 7.—On sea and on land and in the air the strong forces of the prohibition enforcement machinery of the federal government today continued their war of extermination against "rum row" and rum running along the Atlantic seaboard and throughout that section.

During the night the big fleet operating against rum row had added to its task the battle of fighting against a forty-five mile gale, but the blockade was not broken while the rum boats had been forced to take to sea.
