BUFFALO, N. Y., Oct. 29.—Robbers today shot and killed one man at a bank in Buffalo and two other employees of the institution were wounded by the bandits. The robbers then made their get-away with money contained in the bank in an automobile. The loot amounted to \$93,000.

The man killed was Charles Clifford, driver of the bank's automobile. L. M. Yarrington, a bank messenger, was shot in the face and about the body, and his condition is said to be critical. John Meyers, another employe of the bank, was also wounded by the hold-up men.

The bank contained approximately \$117,000, but the bandits overlooked about \$24,000 in their haste to escape.




