LIVING CONDITIONS ARE HIGHEST IN HISTORY

(By Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—Material living conditions for the American people during the last year have been the highest in all history. Secretary Herbert Hoover declared today in an economic review which was made public as a part of the annual report of the Department of Commerce.

Factors listed by the secretary as contributing to this condition included practically the complete absence of unemployment, high wages, efficient railway operation, and equitable balanced prices as among the great producing groups. The population has gradually returned to stable currency, and normal business operation among the nations abroad.

21 DEFENDANTS PLEAD NOT GUILTY

INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 7.—Twenty-one out of thirty-nine defendants who were recently indicted by the federal grand jury here in connection with alleged illegal withdrawals of \$1,800,000 worth of bonded liquor from the Jack Daniel Distillery at St. Louis, entered pleas of not guilty when arraigned today.

The trial of the thirty-nine defendants are set tentatively for December 14th.

ITALIANS MAKE MANY ARRESTS

ROME, Nov. 7.—Further important arrests and detentions are reported in various parts of Italy today in connection with the plot against the life of Premier Mussolini.

The conspiracy, which was of wide ramifications, was declared in some quarters to have been aimed not alone at Mussolini, but at the overthrow of the Savoy dynasty and the establishment of an Italian republic.

VALLEY CREEK BOY KILLED BY TRUCK

Last Sunday a deplorable accident occurred on Fritz Kraatz's place out on Valley Creek when Elton Williams Persky, the 8-year and 11-month old son of Mr. and Mrs. Persky, who were here from the drought-stricken section of the state picking cotton, was accidentally run over by a truck driven by a boy of Mr. Kraatz, which resulted in his death some two hours later.

It seems that the little fellow was attempting to jump on the truck when he slipped and fell under the wheels with the results as stated above.

The body was prepared for burial by Spill Bros., local funeral directors, and shipped to Sharp, Texas, where interment was to be had.

A petition soliciting aid for the family was being circulated in Winters Monday by Valley Creek citizens, Mrs. Persky being ill in bed at the time, and was meeting with a generous response from our citizens when seen by an Enterprise reporter.

The stricken family have the sympathy of all who heard of their sad plight.—Winters Enterprise.

AUSTIN, Nov. 7.—Houston was selected as the 1926 convention city of the Tax Assessors Association of Texas in its closing session here today. Charles Hickcox, tax assessor of Dallas county, was named president of the association for the current year.

LADIES PUSH SALE OF POPPIES

The poppy sale being conducted today by the American Legion Auxiliary started with a bang early Saturday morning. A. R. Jones bought the first poppy sold and the ladies were busy all the forenoon pinning the red flowers on the clerks and people in the stores. The ladies were well pleased with the sale up to noon and all indications were that it would run a larger volume than ever before. The large poppies which were sold to the firms, brought in almost \$100, and the ladies reported that practically every firm in Ballinger bought a generous amount.

Money derived from the sale of the poppies by the Auxiliary will be divided 50-50. Half of the proceeds will be sent to the national headquarters of the Auxiliary to be used in assisting disabled soldiers of the World War. The other half stays in the treasury of the local organization to be used by it during the year for a similar purpose.

RELATIVES SAY BOY WAS KILLED

BEAUMONT, Nov. 7.—Relatives, after identifying the body of a youth in a hotel room here yesterday with a bullet hole through his head, as Clarence Bradley, stated today that he was 22 years old, lived at Houston, and had been a student in the medical college of Tulane University at New Orleans.

Bradley's kinsmen discounted the coroner's verdict of suicide, and the Houston police have launched an investigation in an effort to discover whether or not the case is one of murder.

LIFELESS BODY WOMAN FOUND

OGDEN, Utah, Nov. 7.—The body of Mrs. Hans Jensen, age 43, owner of a beauty parlor here, was found in a thicket in the Southern part of the city today.

Nearby was a broken hammer and a small sharp knife. The woman apparently had been struck on the head with the hammer and an effort made to cut off her head.

CHICAGO, Nov. 7.—Assistant Secretary Andrews today called upon all states and communities to encourage the resumption of home rule in the enforcement of prohibition. It is only by such an effort, he declared, that the federal agents could be removed from the status of "village policemen."

Addressing the national convention of the Anti Saloon League the treasury official, who is the directing head of all federal prohibition enforcement, declared that the department had now concentrated its efforts upon dividing the work equally between the state and federal authorities, in order that there may be more punch in law enforcement and more speed and understanding in permissive work and avoidance of overlapping duties.

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Total ginnings at Winters up to Thursday of this week were 17,476 bales. That figured a total of 1,220 bales ginned for the week.

Officials of the Nolan County Fair Association have announced that the association will about break even on the 1925 fair at Sweetwater, although they experienced bad weather the entire week of their fair. Everyone in that section is enthusiastic over the outcome of their fair and it is planned to sell more stock and do considerable improvement before next show dates.

The Nolan county grand jury at Sweetwater finished their labors last week and returned twenty-three felony bills. The grand jury also recommended to the commissioners' court that a new modern jail be erected, and complained to the district court about the increasing amount of drunkenness in that part of West Texas.

The newly proposed irrigation district which was discussed at a mass meeting in Robert Lee a few days ago has already started both sides to working. The Robert Lee Observer carried a long article from some gentleman this week who was opposed to the creation of the district, claiming that the cost of the project would bankrupt the entire country.

Frosts, freezes, insects and recent rains, it is estimated by good judges of the size of the present cotton crop, will reduce the Texas, Oklahoma and Arkansas yield over 5,000,000 bales. Under such circumstances it looks as if the price of cotton ought to go up very soon. Nearly all thoughtful observers are sure that the government over-guessed the size of the present crop, therefore it might be wise for the careful farmer to hold his cotton for better prices than the present ones.

Armistice Day celebrations in West Texas are plentiful this year and everyone will have an opportunity of observing the day to their liking. Brownwood will have a big parade, service and afternoon attractions. Abilene is planning for a big day which will open with a parade in the morning. Coleman will observe the holiday with services in the morning and a rodeo in the afternoon. San Angelo Angelo will stage a parade, service and various attractions in the afternoon. Ballinger will entertain Sweetwater here with an all-day affair.

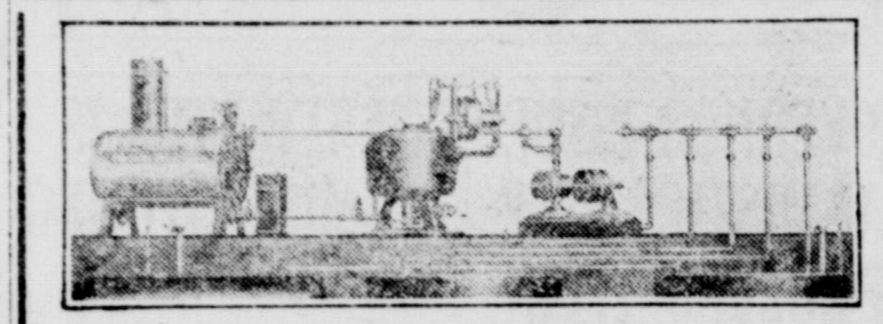

SATURDAY AFTERNOON CABLES

LONDON, Nov. 7.—A number of British clubmen who returned recently from the United States contend that there is more prohibition in England than in the United States, and they are using this argument in a movement designed to bring about longer hours in which drinks may be served in clubrooms.

English clubs, like the public houses, must close their bars for nine or ten out of the 24 hours, different cities and boroughs having varying regulations. Recently a delegation of club members, representing all classes of clubs in the country conferred with Sir William Joynson-Hicks, the home secretary, in the hope of receiving permission to run things in the matters of drinks a little more to their own liking. The London clubmen who visited the United States say that they visited numerous clubs in New York and other American

cities and were served with drinks morning, noon and night and even in the early hours before dawn.

PARIS, Nov. 7.—La Fronde, known as the "Trouserless Daily" because of its all-feminine staff, is being revived and will again be directed by its picturesque editor, Mme. Marguerite Durand.

The paper was a great success in pre-war days in championing women's rights and the beautiful Mme. Durand not only conducted bitter editorial battles, but led the militant suffragists dressed in exquisite gowns and wearing jewels.

"Feminine France owes much to my blonde hair," she used to say, and the success of La Fronde seemed to justify her, until one fine day the paper disappeared and the war ended hopes for its revival.

Influential Paris newspaper writers are welcoming the resurrection of the paper, warmly saluting Mme. Durand as "the first woman to put grace and elegance into the feminist movement and to show that coquetry and seductive femininity are not incompatible with suffragism.

BERLIN, Nov. 7.—German fastidiousness has driven "hot dog" stands, patterned after those in America, from the streets of Ber-

lin. The "hot dog" sold from stands in the streets was introduced here a few months ago, but the idea of stopping at the curb to grab a sandwich failed to appeal, because the Berliners could not persuade themselves that the food was wholesome and clean.

Enterprising vendors, inspired by the success of Tingvad, Copenhagen, set up their green and white painted carts, and the vendors dressed in white with cooks' headgear. They sold the "hot dog" sandwiches for the equivalent of a nickel. The carts were labelled "Fruehstuecken-Wagen," or "breakfast wagon."

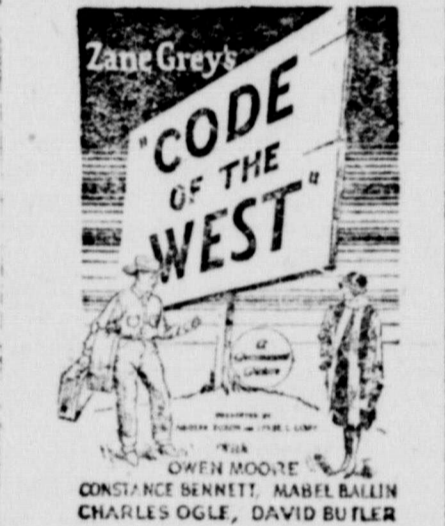
But the people failed to buy. The "hot dog" men also complain that the police forced their carts to disadvantageous locations, such as are designated for fruit peddlers.

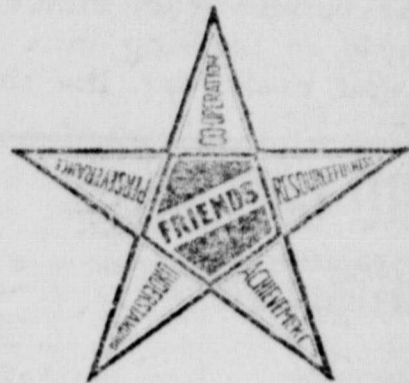

WOODWARD GOES TO WASHINGTON

(Coleman Democrat-Voice)
State Senator Walter C. Woodward left Monday evening for Austin to join members of the State Board of Control who left that city Tuesday night for Washington on business pertaining to the sale of the American Legion Memorial Hospital at Kerrville to the federal government. Before leaving Mr. Woodward said:
"At the last session of the Senate, I introduced a bill, at the request of the American Legion, providing for the sale of the Kerrville Memorial Hospital to the federal government. This bill became a law and authorized the State Board of Control and the governor to make the sale, the proceeds to be divided between the state and the American Legion in proportion to the amount paid by each. The State Board of Control has negotiated with the War Department for the taking over of this property, but final arrangements will have to be completed next week. The

State Board of Control has invited me as a representative of the Senate, to accompany them to Washington in order to make the final transfer of the property. The sale of this hospital means much to Texas; in fact, if Texas maintains the hospital it will require an appropriation of approximately \$500,000 per year to maintain it. The American Legion and all other interested parties see the absolute necessity of transferring this property to the federal government, otherwise the state will have to make large appropriations in order to maintain it. We hope to make the final transfer next week conveying the property to the federal government."

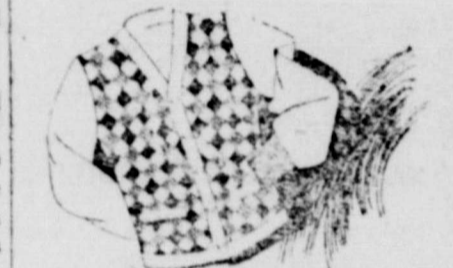

Southern Baptist Baptisms Set New Evangelistic Mark
(By Associated Press)
NASHVILLE, Tenn., Nov. 5.—With the administering of 1,037,550 baptisms by the Southern Baptist Church during the last five years, a new evangelistic record for all evangelical denominations has been established, said Dr. E. P. Alldredge, statistical secretary.
Dr. Alldredge said that this is an average of 207,510 baptisms annually for the five years of 1920-24, inclusive, and 48 baptisms for every daylight hour.
The highest previous record of Southern Baptists in baptisms was 714,333 for the five-year period of 1915-19, inclusive.
