TELLS OF ARREST OF WHISKY PETE

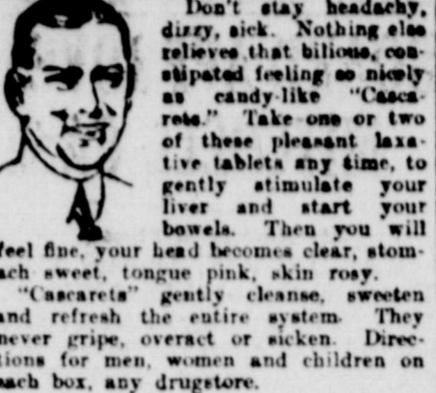

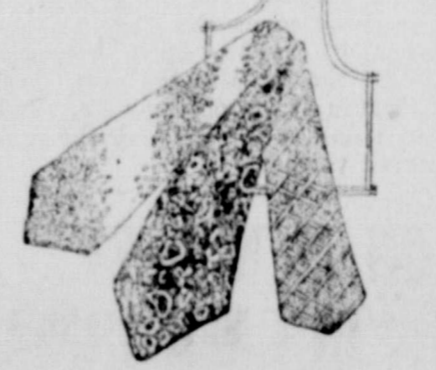

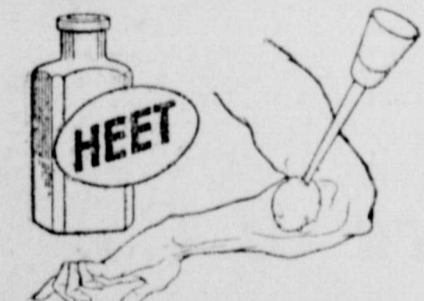
